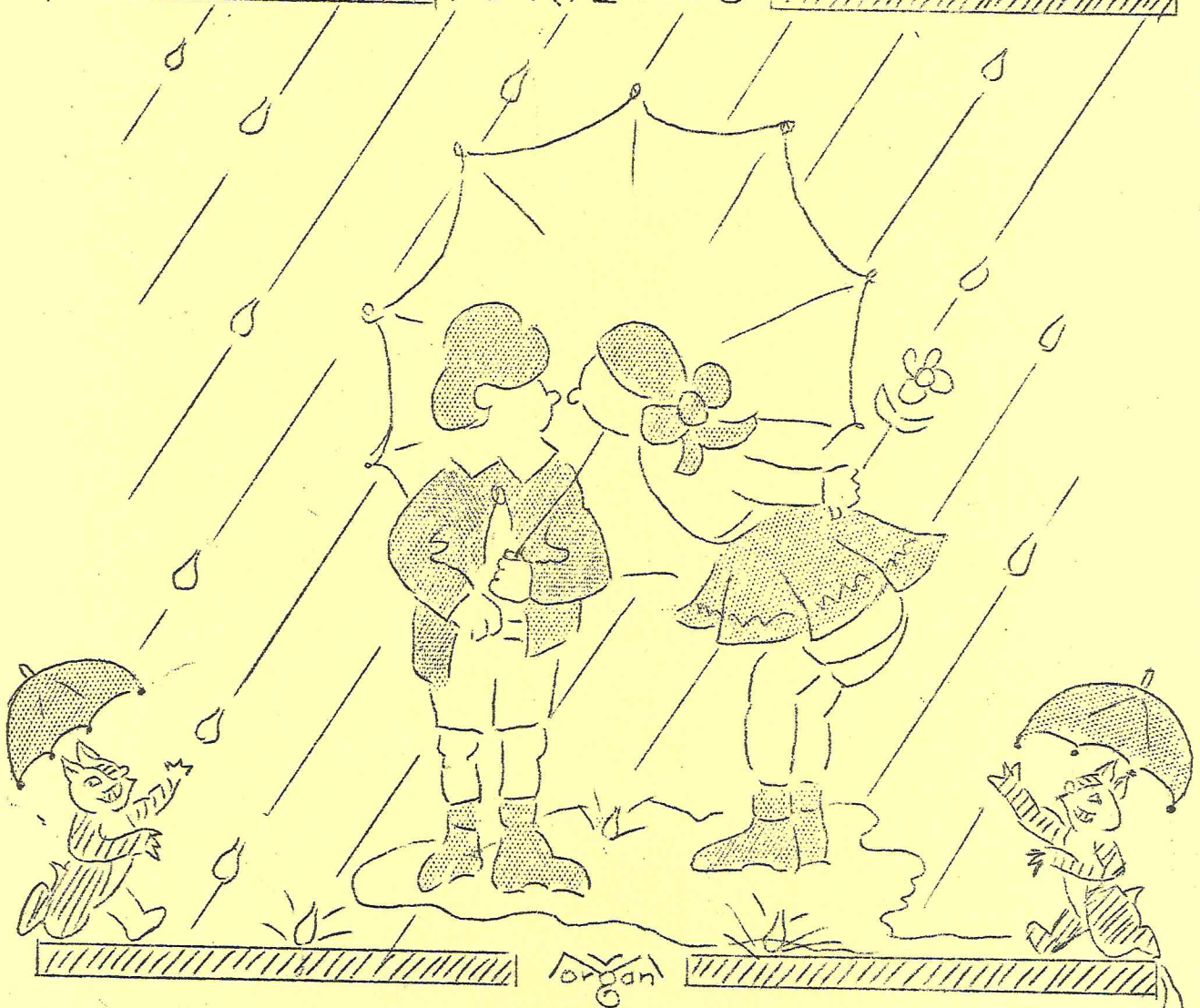

KITCHEN KORNER

Stekely Gulyas

Saute in heavy skillet
 1/3 c. finely chopped onion
 in
 2 tbsp. shortening
 Add
 2 lb. mixed lean meat
 (beef, veal, pork)
 cut in 1 in. pieces
 fry 30 minutes
 Stir in
 2 one lb. cans sauerkraut
 (drained)
 1 bay leaf crumbled
 Simmer covered for 1 1/2 hours
 until meat and sauerkraut are
 tender.

Add a little water. Season
 to taste with salt and pepper.
 Just before serving, stir in
 1 c. cultured sour cream

Amount: 4 to 6 servings.

BROILED CHICKEN

Allow 1/2 small broiler for each
 serving. Split down back and
 wipe with damp cloth. Soak for
 one hour in
 olive oil seasoned with
 1 onion sliced, salt,
 pepper, parsley and
 lemon juice.
 Lift from dressing. Do not
 drain. Dredge with flour. Set
 to broil under flame. First
 searing the flesh side, then the
 skin side. Finish on the flesh
 side. Broil about 20 minutes
 in all.

Serve with a sauce made of
 4 tbsp. melted butter
 Juice of 1 lemon and
 1 small glass of grape juice

QUICK TUNA DISH

1 can cream of mushroom soup
 1 cup milk (blend very creamy)
 1 can tuna fish (6 1/2 oz.)
 3/4 cup peas
 2 hard boiled eggs
 (if no canned cream of mushroom
 soup, make 1 cup thick white
 sauce.)

Heat, and serve over any of the
 following: Chinese crisp
 noodles, rice, shell macaroni,
 waffles, mashed potatoes, or
 broad noodles.

 cheese
 1 cup flour
 1/4 teaspoon salt

Mix together. Knead well and
 roll thin. Cut one round piece
 with hole in center and another
 whole one. Put the two together

 jelly and powdered sugar.
