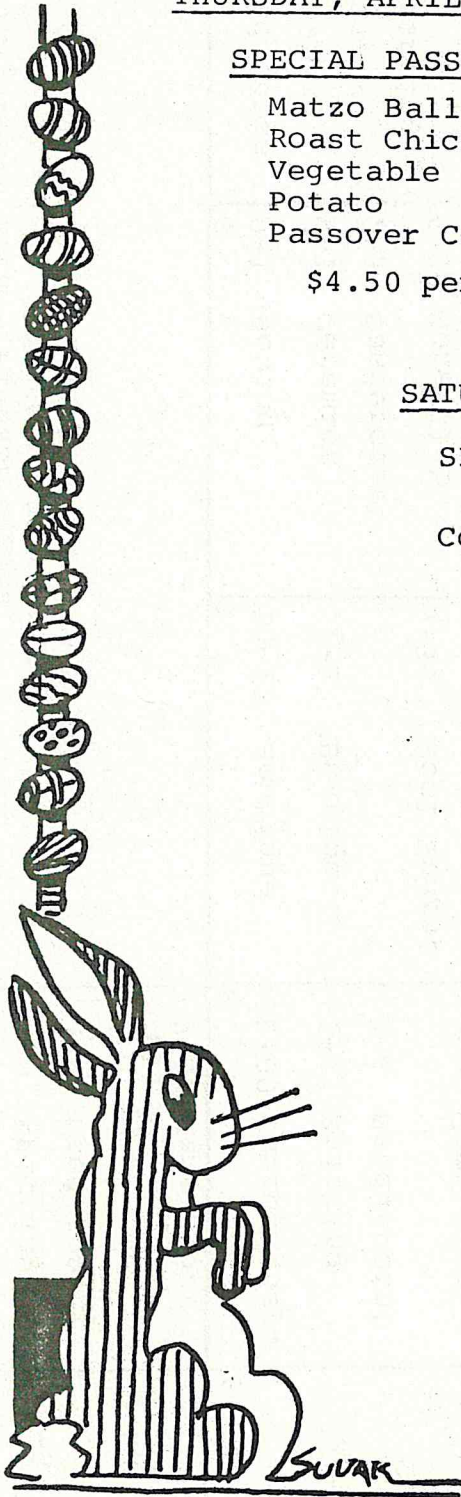

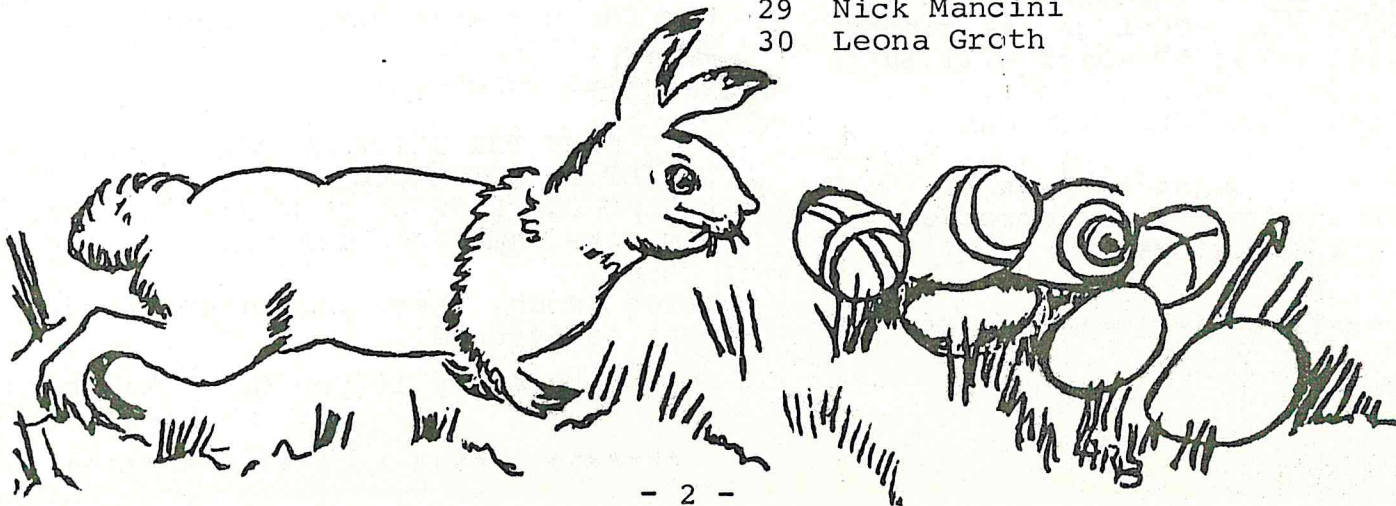

After lunch, very special entertainment is planned.

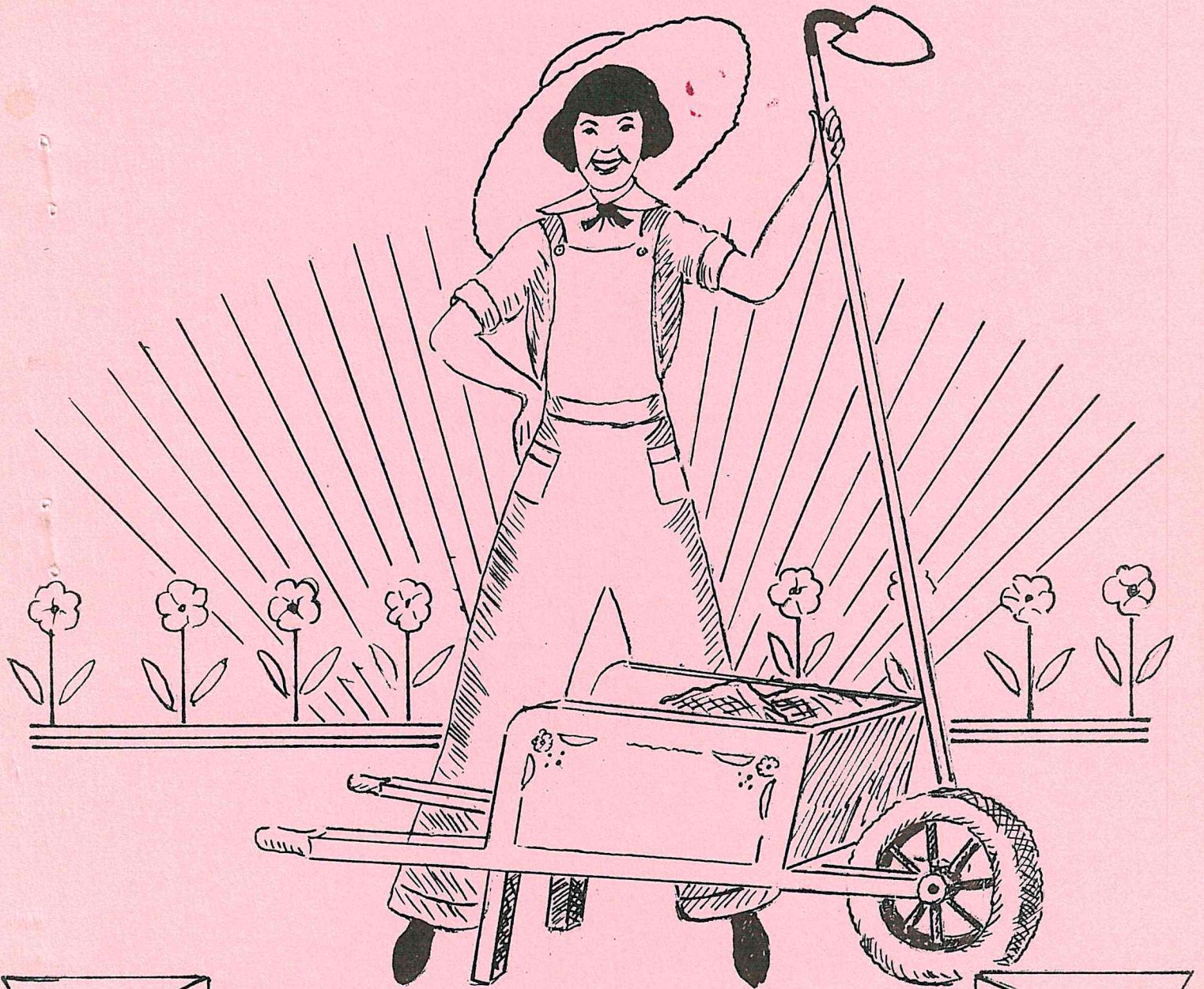
