

Though April showers may come our way during this month, it will be a time of sunshine within the Villa Serena, because of our "April Showers-Sunshine Dance".


The occasion will take place on THURSDAY, APRIL 25th. You will be able to dance to your heart's content to the music of Ed and Gilda Cifani.
