



This victory kept the French from assiting the American Confederate Army, Later, Union forces were sent assist the Mexican Army.

In gratitude, thousands of Mexicans crossed the border after Pearl Harbor to join the U.S. Armed Forces. As recently as the Persian Gulf War, Mexicans flooded American Consulates with phone calls, trying to join another war for America.

Mexicans, you see, never forget who their friends are, and neither do Americans. Thats why Cinco de Mayo is such a party, we celebrate freedom and liberty - two ideals we share.

Cinco de Mayo has become more of a Chicano (Mexican-American) holiday than a Mexican one. People of Mexican descent in the United States celebrate with music, dance and parades.


