

KITCHEN KORNER

CHICKEN SOUFFLE

- 3 lb. chicken, cooked
- 1 lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 eggs
- l cup thin cream

Make white sauce by blending melted butter and flour, then adding the cream and the beaten yolks of the 2 eggs. Season to taste with salt and pepper and cook 5 minutes. Add chicken and sliced mushrooms, and two egg whites beaten stiff.

Place in buttered casserole and cover with slightly buttered fine bread crumbs. Bake in a hot oven about 30 minutes.

ORANGE OMELET

- 1 T orange juice 2 eggs
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. shortening
- 1 T water
- 1/4 tsp. salt

Beat the whites of the eggs very stiff, but not dry, and beat the yolks until lemon-colored. Add the water, salt and orange juice to the yolks. Fold in the stiffly beaten whites, and turn into a small omelet pan in which the shortening has been heated. Cook slowly, stirring carefully from the center. Stand in the oven until golden brown, turn onto a hot plate, and serve at once. -- Amelia Nagy

ONE EGG CHOCOLATE CAKE WITH MOCHA FROSTING

2 cups sifted cake flour 3 tsp. baking powder Pinch of salt
4 T butter 1 tsp. vanilla 1 cup sugar 1 egg 3/4 cup milk

To sifted flour add baking powder and salt and sift together. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually and cream together until light and fluffy. Add egg and beat very thoroughly. Add flour alternately with milk, a small amount at a time. Beat after each addition. Bake in two buttered layer pans in moderate oven about 25 to 30 minutes. Spread Mocha Frosting between layers and on top of cake.

MOCHA FROSTING

- 4 T butter
- 2 cups sifted confectioners sugar
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 2 squares chocolate, melted
- 4 T hot coffee

Cream butter, add one cup sugar and cream together thoroughly. Add vanilla and chocolate. Add remaining sugar gradually, beating well after each addition. Thin with coffee until of right consistency to spread. --Amelai Nagy
