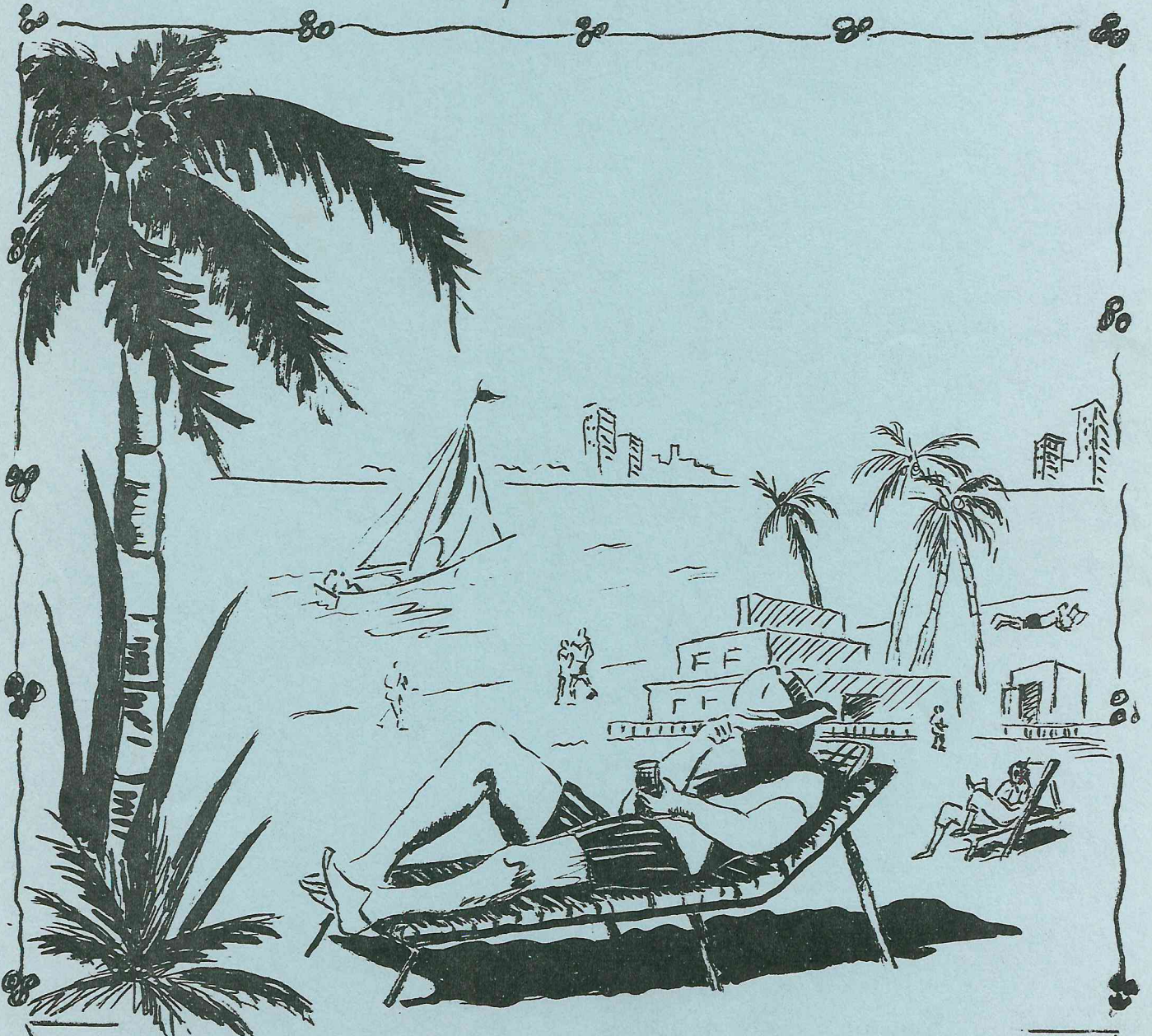

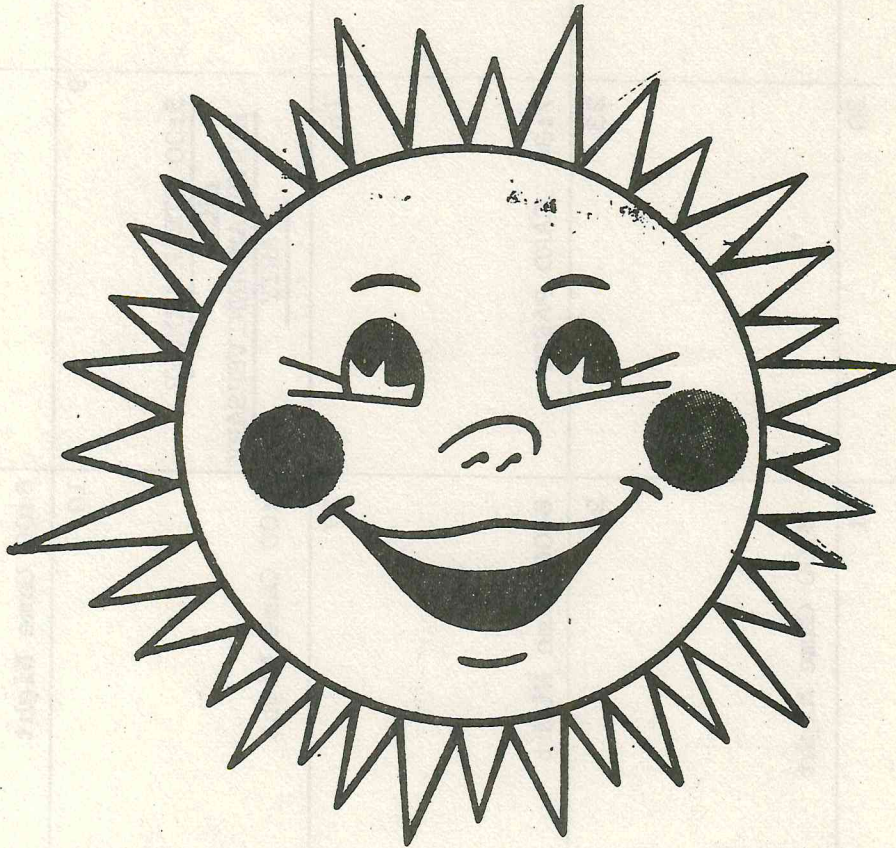

KITCHEN KORNER

LIME SNOW

This lime snow has only 13 calories per serving.

- 1 envelope (1 tablespoon) unflavored gelatin
- 1 1/4 cups cold water, divided
- Non-nutritive sweetener equivalent to 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup lime juice
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon or lime rind
- 2 unbeaten egg whites
- Green food coloring

Sprinkle gelatin over 1/2 cup cold water in saucepan. Place over moderate heat. Stir constantly until gelatin dissolves, 2 to 3 minutes.

Remove from heat. Stir in sweetener, remaining 3/4 cup water, lime juice and lemon rind. Chill until slightly thicker than unbeaten egg whites.

Add unbeaten egg whites and a few drops food coloring and beat with rotary beater or electric mixer until fluffy and mixture begins to hold its shape. Turn into a 6 cup mold. Chill until firm. Garnish as desired. Makes 6 servings.

When transplanting flowers or seedlings in small pots, try using a shoe horn in place of a trowel.
