CHANGES TO BE MADE

Yet, in spite of all of this, we have concern and problems in how do we continue excellence in an inflationary world without addressing ourselves to the ongoing increased costs.

After much deliberation and soul searching, we have determined that our people and supporters do not want to give up quality for a few dollars. Therefore, I am informing everyone that effective September 1, 1985, the following new policy will be in effect at the Villa Serena.

All new members and renewals of membership will be at the rate of \$9.00 per year per person. This is only a \$2.00 increase and if memory serves me correctly, it is the first increase in many years and still a most reasonable one considering how much postage has increased for the mailing of the Villa Voice alone and we do pay for the major portions of all of our entertainment programs.

Also effective September 1, 1985, our regular dinners will be increased to \$4.50 per person. Considering that the Villa Serena provides you all with "bottomless cups of coffee" and "all the bread" you can consume, this in itself is a small increase.

How about celebrating by wearing some type of western attire whether it be a cowboy outfit or simply a bandana.


