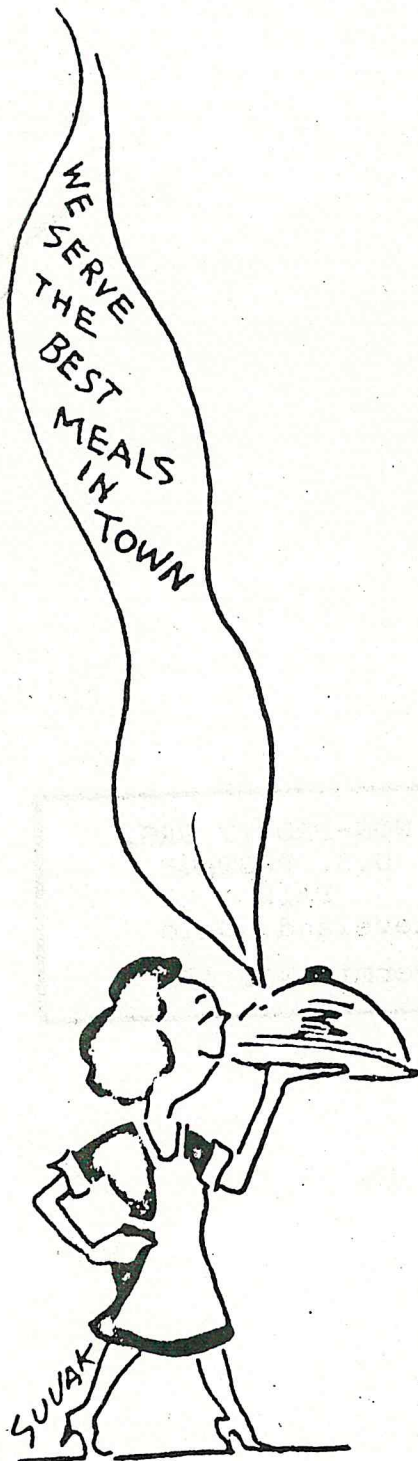

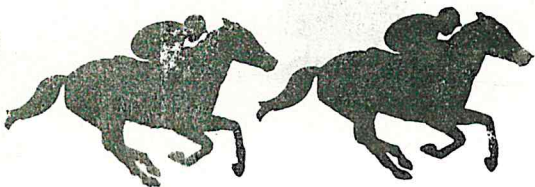
You still have some time to get a few bucks together for the big day. Circle the date in red! This is a once a year chance to get rich quick. Good luck to all! Sign up now.
