Dear Son: Just a line to let you know that I am still alive. I am writing this letter slowly as I know you can't read fast.

You won't know the house when you come home. We have moved. It was a lot of trouble moving. The hardest was the bed - you see, the man didn't want to let us take it in the taxie. It would not have been so bad if your father hand't been in it at the time. About your father, he has a wonderful new job. He has 500 people under him. He is cutting grass in the cemetery.

Our new neighbors started raising pigs - we just got wind of it this morning. I got my appendix out and a dishwasher put in. There was a washing machine in the new house but isn't working too well. Last week I put four shirts in it, pulled the chain and I haven't seen the shirts since.

Your sister Mary had a baby this morning. I haven't heard if it is a boy or a girl, so I can't tell you if you are an aunt or an uncle.

Your little brother came home from school yesterday crying. All the boys at school have new suits. We can't afford to buy him one but we will get him a new hat and let him stand in the window.


The total cost is \$16.00 and that includes a sit down lunch, program book, admission to the track and transportation. A very good deal, we think.
