A POLISH MOTHER'S LETTER TO HER SON

Dear Son: Just a line to let you know that I am still alive. I am writing this letter slowly as I know you can't read fast.

You won't know the house when you come home. We have moved. It was a lot of trouble moving. The hardest was the bed - you see, the man didn't want to let us take it in the taxie. It would not have been so bad if your father hand't been in it at the time. About your father, he has a wonderful new job. He has 500 people under him. He is cutting grass in the cemetery.

Our new neighbors started raising pigs - we just got wind of it this morning. I got my appendix out and a dishwasher put in. There was a washing machine in the new house but isn't working too well. Last week I put four shirts in it, pulled the chain and I haven't seen the shirts since.

Your sister Mary had a baby this morning. I haven't heard if it is a boy or a girl, so I can't tell you if you are an aunt or an uncle.

Your little brother came home from school yesterday crying. All the boys at school have new suits. We can't afford to buy him one but we will get him a new hat and let him stand in the window.

Uncle Dick was drowned last week in a vat of whiskey at the Dublin works. Four of his workmates dived in to save him but he fought them off bravely. We cremated his body and it took three days to put out the fire.

Your father didn't have too much to drink at Christmas. I put a bottle of castor oil in his pint of scotch and it kept him going till New Year's. I went to the doctor Thursday - your father went with me. The doctor put a small glass tube in my mouth and said to keep it shut for 10 minutes. Your father offered to buy it from him.

It only rained twice last week - first 4 days and then for 3. On Monday it was so windy that one of the chickens laid the same egg 4 times.
