





Christmas and New Year are upon us, and once again we ask where or where have the past twelve months gone????


It seems we were just getting ready to til the soil for spring gardens and the calendar now informs us that we must start shopping for Christmas trees.


We have made many new friends this year. Let's keep those friendships alive, but let's not forget our old friends who still may need that bit of extra special hand of friendship to let them know you still care.
