No sooner did we get back from our "fabuluous and fantastic" trip to Las Vegas, when we began to hear, "Where is the next trip going to be??"







Its going to be the nicest pre-Lenten celebration you will have ever attended. Cost for the entire evening will be \$6.50 per person.


