



## Social Security Earnings Limits

The Spelai Security Administration has announced increases in the amounts one can earn without suffering loss of benefits.

For those under the age of 65, the limit rises from \$9,600 to \$10,080, or \$840 a month.

For those from age 65 to age 69. the limit rises from \$15,500 to \$17,000, or \$1,417 a month.

For those over 70, there is no limit to earnings.

If you exceed the earnings limit, the SSA will penalize you \$1 for each \$3 you earn over that amount.

If you also get Supplemental Security Income (SSI), you must report all earnings.

#### Attention All Veterans

The family of any honorably discharged veteran who was a resident of Cuyahoga County for a total of five years is eligible to receive \$1,000 to

help pay for his or her burial expenses. The deceased must be buried within the county. For more information, contact the Veterans Service Commission at (216)-698-2600.
