
MARDI GRAS COMES TO THE VILLA

MEAL-IN-ONE MEATLOAF

1 can (1 pound) peas and carrots
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/2 cup fine dry bread crumbs
1/4 cup catsup
1 envelope (3/4 ounce) brown
 gravy mix
1 pound ground beef

Drain liquid from peas and carrots, saving 1/4 cup.
Combine the 1/4 cup liquid with egg, bread crumbs, catsup and contents of gravy mix envelope. Add beef (browned in pan) and vegetables; mix lightly.

Spoon into greased 9 x 5 x 3 inch loaf pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Serves 4 to 6.




