



How about the beautiful Christmas art work on our first floor windows this year!!!


They were the creation of none other than <u>Vern Morgan</u>, who has been a devoted member for many years as well as a dedicated art class participant.


In spite of the many problems faced by our country and by our friends and ourselves during the past year, we still have many things to be thankful for.
