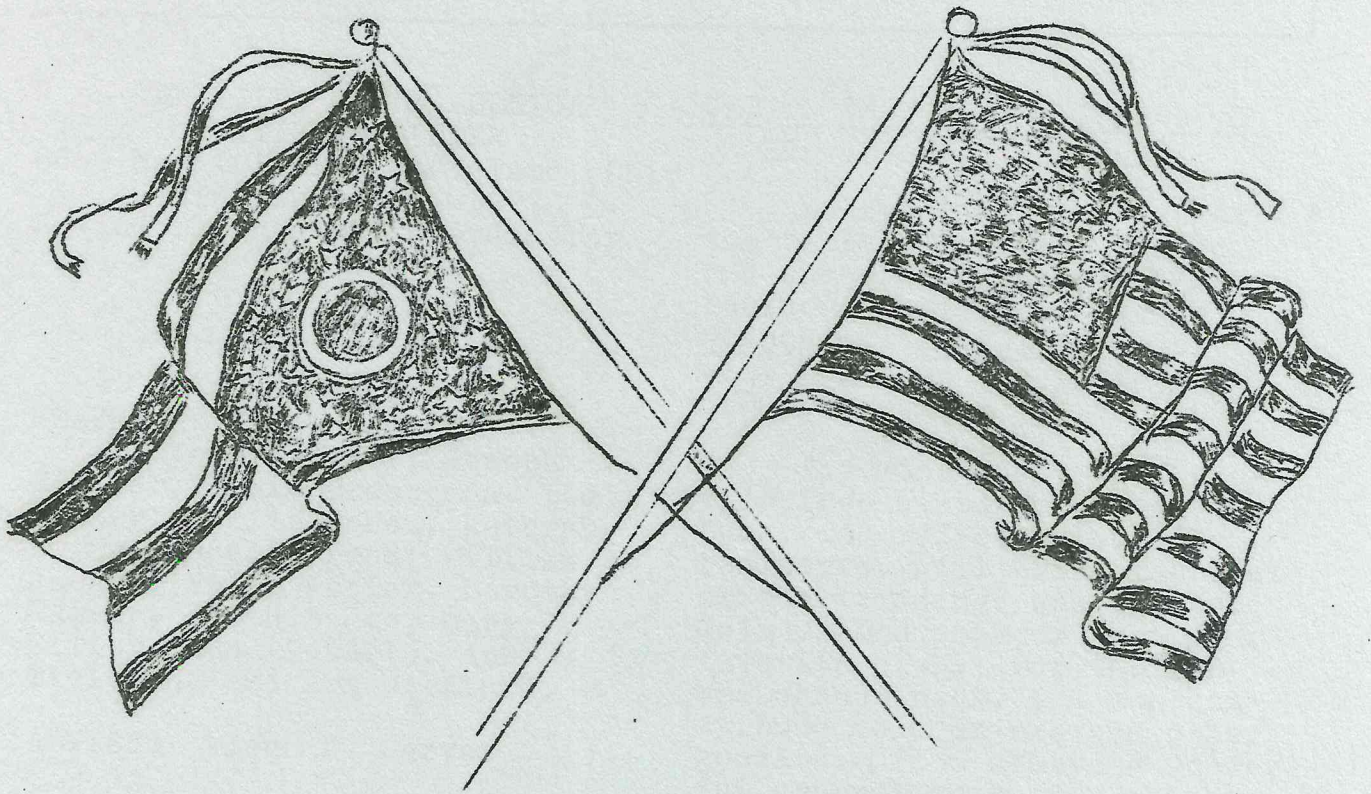

KITCHEN KORNER

PRELBYTERIAN CASSEROLE

- 2-1/2 C chicken, diced
- 2 cans mushroom soup
- 1/2 C chicken broth
- 1 C sliced mushrooms
- 1/2 C whole cashews
- 2 C onion, chopped
- 2 C celery, chopped
- 2 C Chinese noodles

Place above ingredients in casserole, reserving 1/2 cup of chinese noodles for topping. Bake in 350° oven for 1 hour with foil cover. Remove foil and brown for 15 more minutes. Serves 4-6.

NO BAKE COOKIES

- 2 C. granulated sugar
- 1/2 C. margarine
- 1/2 C. milk
- 4 T cocoa
- 1/2 C. peanut butter
- 2 T vanilla
- 3 C. oatmeal, regular, uncooked

Place the first 4 ingredients in a 3 or 4 quart saucepan. Bring to a boil; and boil for 3 minutes after start of rolling boil. Remove from heat and mix in well the remaining ingredients. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto wax paper or foil and let cool. Makes about 50 cookies.

Secret: When combining two or more fruit juices or beverages, always have one predominate in flavor.
