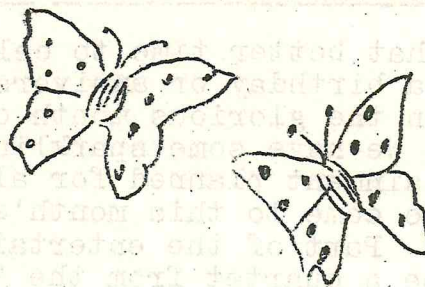

KITCHEN KORNER

LIVER AND RICE PATTIS

- 1 lb. beef liver
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1/4 tsp. celery salt
- 1/4 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- 1 tablespoon grated onion
- 3/4 tsp. salt
- Tomato Sauce

Remove skin of liver. Pour boiling water over liver and allow to stand for 3 min. Run liver through food chopper with the rice and seasonings and remaining ingredients. Shape meat mixture into flat cakes and fry in a small amount of butter or fat. Serve with Tomato Sauce.

SPINACH HUNGARIAN STYLE

- 2 cups boiled, drained, and chopped spinach
- 4 hard boiled eggs
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 tsp. paprika, salt, & black pepper

Melt the butter and flour. Add seasonings and milk. Bring to the boiling point, stirring constantly until thick. Arrange the hot spinach in a serving dish and slice the eggs over the top. Pour on the hot sauce and serve at once.

LIVER AND RICE PATTIES

- 1 lb. beef liver
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1/4 cup celery salt
- 1/4 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- 1 tablespoon grated onion
- 1/4 cup salt
- Tomato Sauce

Remove skin of liver. Pour boiling water over liver and allow to stand for 3 min. Run liver through food chopper with the rice and seasonings and remaining ingredients. Shape meat mixture into flat cakes and fry in a small amount of butter or fat. Serve with Tomato Sauce.
