




LIVER AND RICE PATTIS

1 lb. beef liver l cup cooked rice 1/4 tsp. celery salt 1/4 tablespoon chopped parsley 1/4 cup chopped celery 1 tablespoon grated onion 3/4 tsp. salt Tomato Sauce
