BUNDT HONEY CAKE

2 eggs
3/4 cup honey
7/8 cup sugar
1/2 cup plus 1 Tbs. oil
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. baking soda
2 cups plus 2 Tbs. flour
2 tsp. cocoa
2 tsp. instant coffee
1 cup hot water
1/2 cup walnuts
1/2 cup raisins

METHOD: Soak raisins in hot water for 10 minutes. Drain. Mix instant coffee with the 1 cup hot water. Beat eggs, sugar and honey for five minutes. Add diluted coffee alternately with dry ingredients. Add nuts and raisins. Bake in well greased Bundt pan at 350°

APPLE NUT TORTE

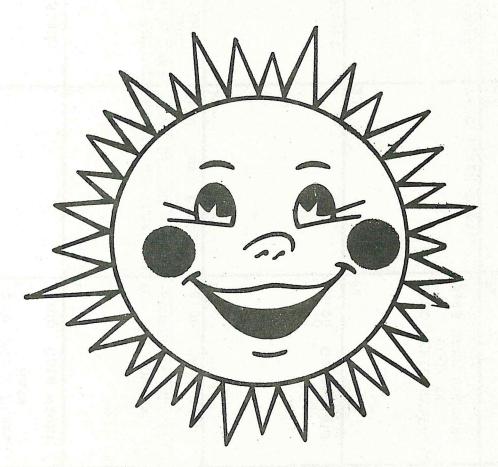
4 eggs, well beaten
1-1/2 cups sugar
1 cup sifted cake flour
1 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
1-1/2 cup chopped apples
1 cup chopped walnuts, pecans or almonds.
Whipped cream or butter cream frosting.

METHOD: Add sugar to beaten eggs. Beat until light and thick. Sift together flour, baking powder, and salt. Fold into egg mixture. Lightly mix in apples and nuts. Bake in greased 9x13x2 inch pan at 350° for 30-40 minutes or until tests done. Serve topped with whipped cream or butter cream frosting.

How to stay well - - --

Water, water everywhere and not a drop to drink. Today this adage is more real than figurative. Do you know that there is not a single major city in the country that provides potable water from a household faucet.

A contributing factor in the surreptitious aging and poisoning of the body is the mixture of chemicals, bacteria, pesticides and industrial waste that is allowed to be introduced into lakes, rivers and wells. Seemingly, water is all around us but this essential lifegiving element is gradually being polluted and depleted. Of course, we cannot drink sea water so our only source is the water from the rain or snow which is evaporated from our oceans and land and stored in lakes, rivers and underground channels. this natural cycle that man is destroying by chemical pollution resulting from pesticides, fertilizers and bacterial growth from the runoff of farmland and industrial dumps.

Even the foods we grow and the fish from the seas are contaminated by undesireable toxins through the water they absorb. No wonder the unsuspecting public is crowding hospitals and doctors' offices without knowing the source of their illness.

What can we do about this? Here are some timely suggestions. When eating in restaurants or other places serving food, never drink the water that is so invitingly profered to you before a meal. For two reasons. First, it is polluted with toxic elements especially chlorine and fluorine, which are toxic poisons in the body. Secondly, for digestive reasons, drinking water during a meal dilutes the saliva and gastric enzymes in the mouth and stomach which retards digestion.

If you are thirsty drink a liquid one half hour before a meal. Drink water only when you are thirsty. Do not load the body with water as a matter of habit.

To obtain potable water, buy spring water or distilled water from a local water supplier, or buy a still and distill your own water. The investment will more than compensate the cost of an illness.

A further suggestion is to buy a good faucet filter activated by charcoal pellets. These have to be replaced periodically and oftentimes this is neglected but many toxic elements can be absorbed by a faucet filter.

One should not drink water that has been processed by a water softener unit as it adds an excess of sodium to the body, too much of which is toxic.

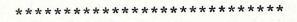

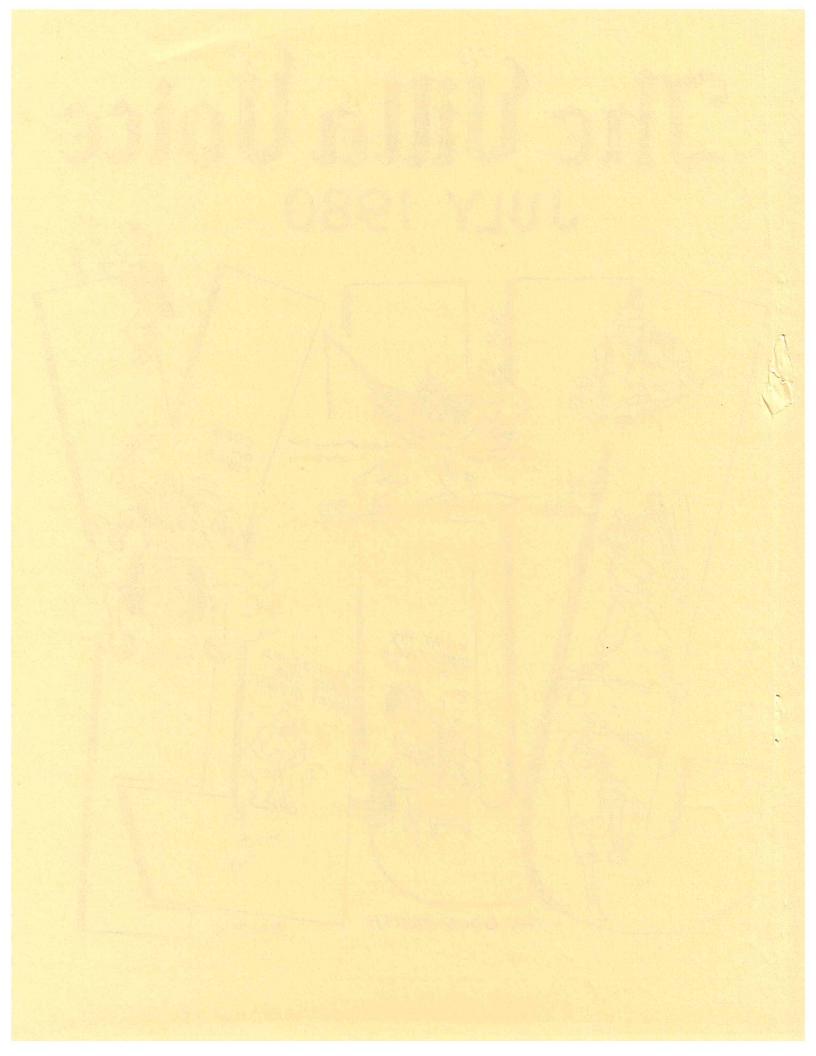
