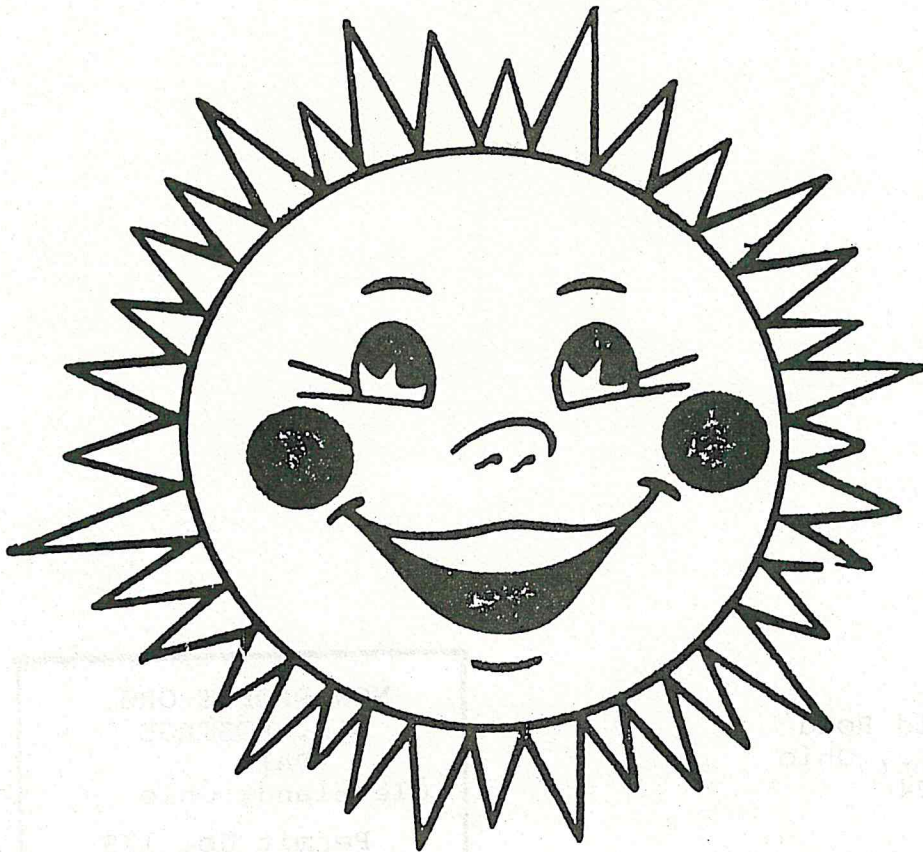

hot dogs, buns and coffee.

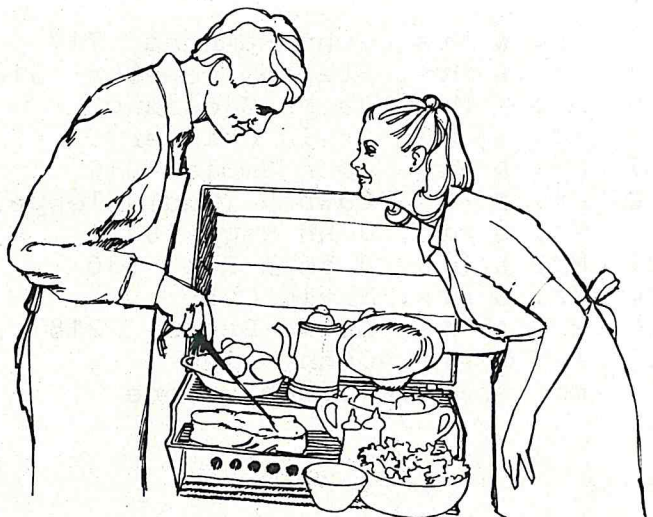
We ask that you refrain from
