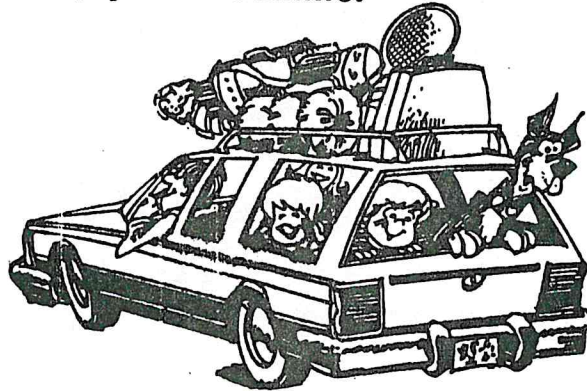

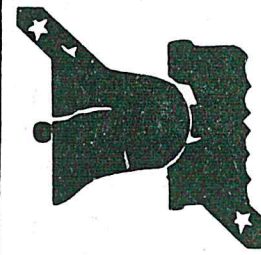

be most appreciated.

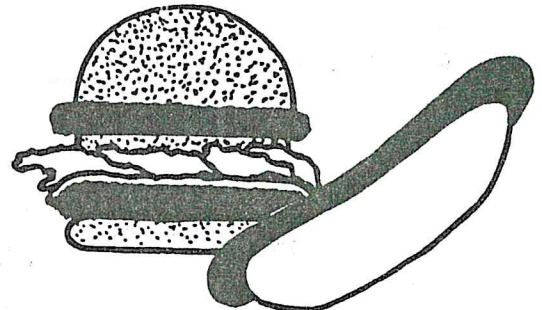
If you don't cook, donations

cooperation.

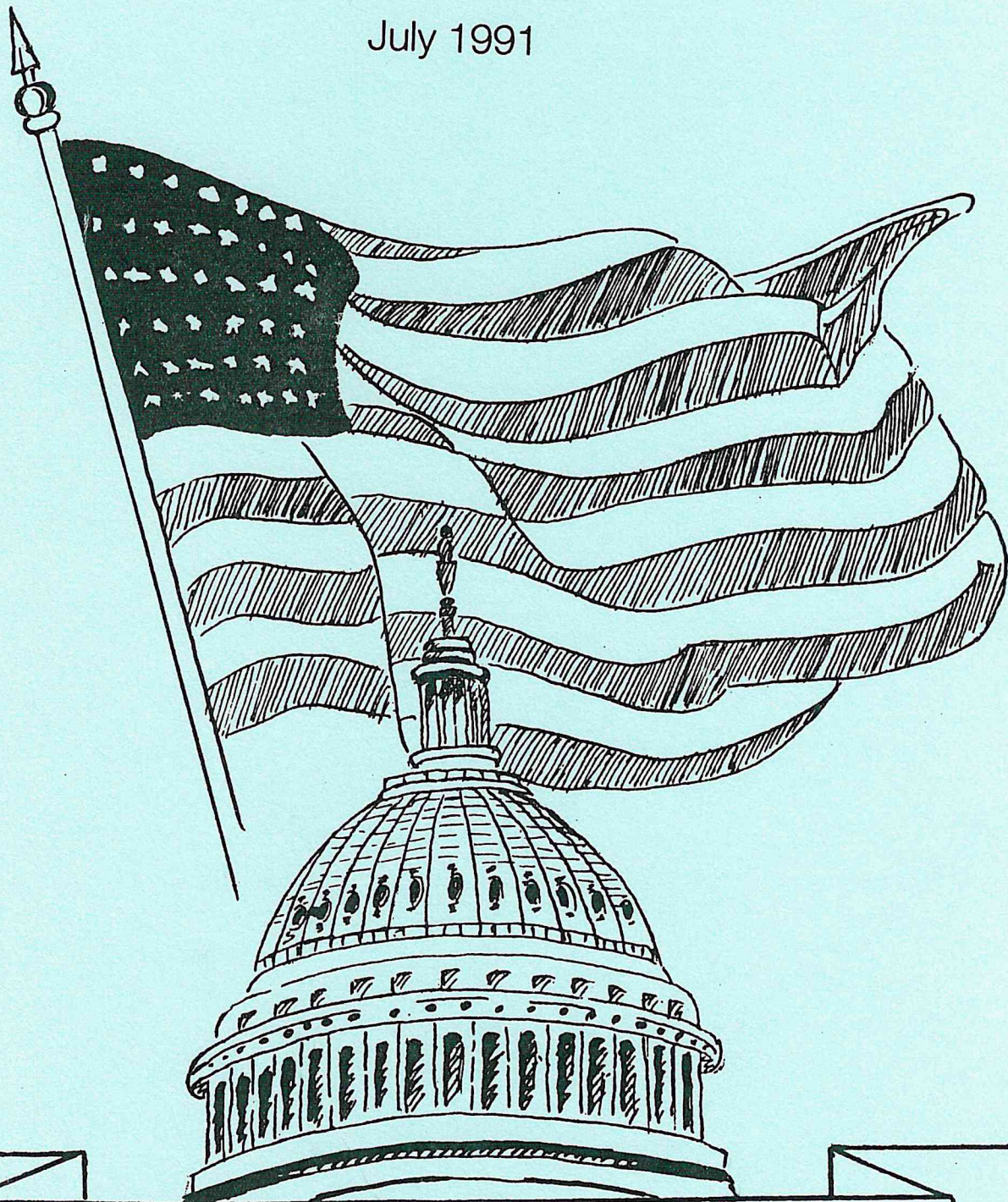
Dinner will be served at 6:00
