

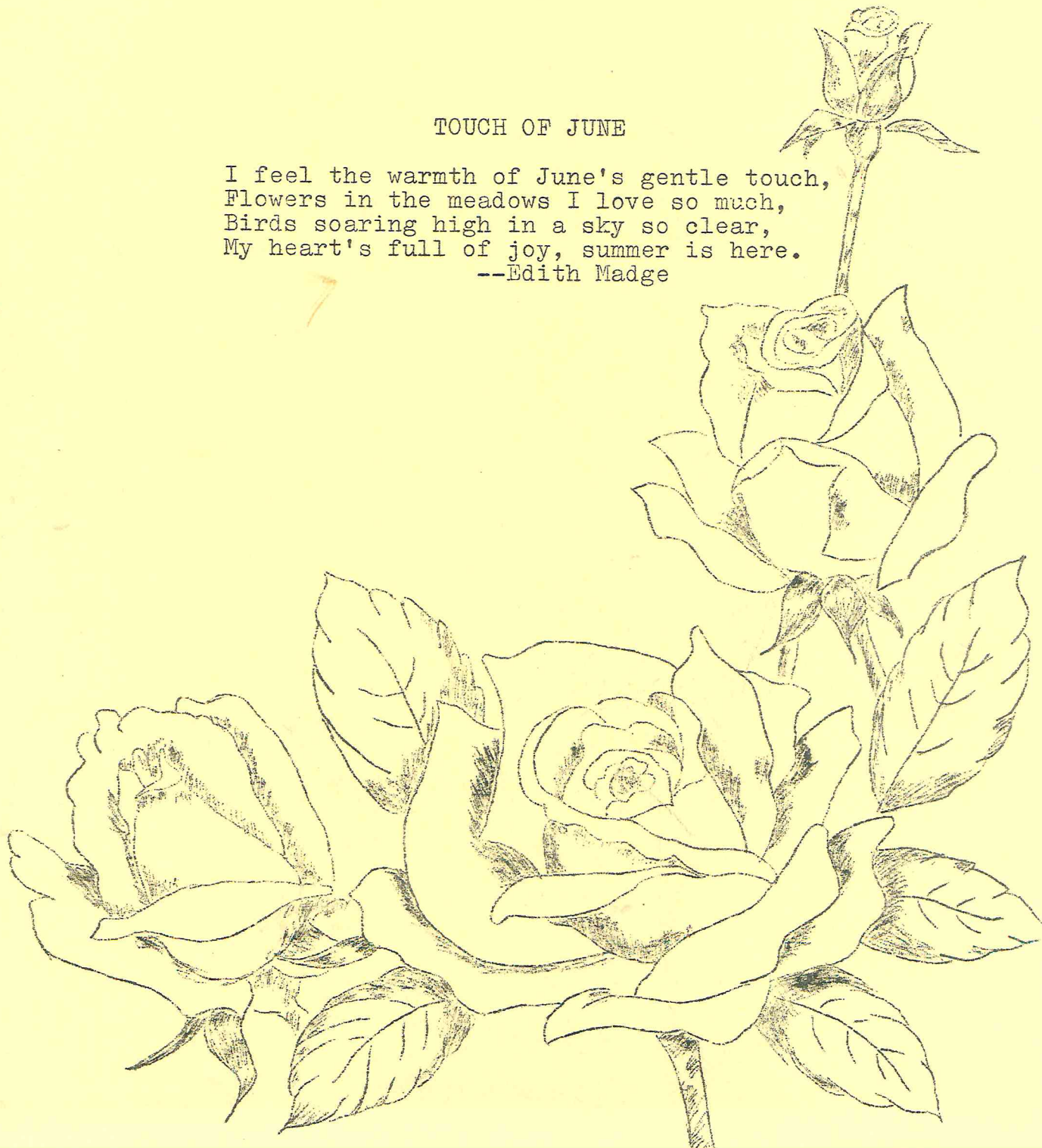

NEW MAY MEMBERSHIPS AND NEW RESIDENT OF THE VILLA SERENA


