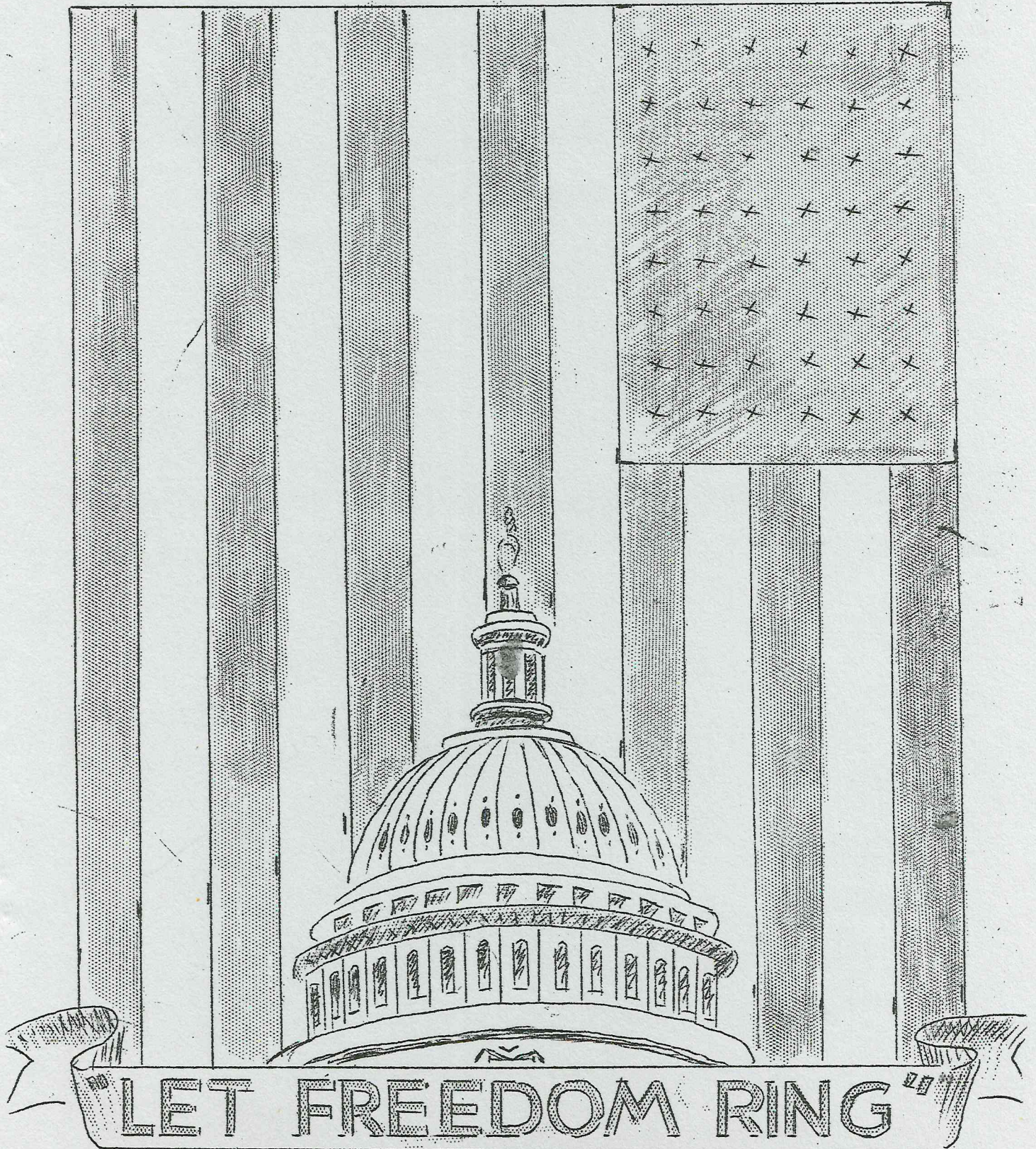

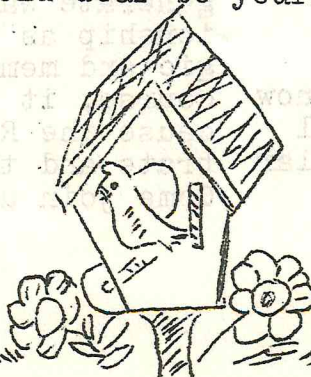

KITCHEN KORNER

PLAIN POTATO SOUP

- 3 potatoes
- 1 T butter or fat
- 1 T flour
- 1 small onion
- dash of paprika
- 1 qt. cold water
- Salt and white pepper
- Celery (1 stalk)
- Chopped parsley

Peel 3 potatoes and cut them in small cubes.
 Melt 1 tablespoon butter or fat. Add one tablespoon flour. Blend well. Then grate in one small onion. Fry gently until yellow. Add a dash of paprika. Pour over it 1 quart of cold water gradually. Mix well and let come to a boil. Add the potatoes salt and a little white pepper, and one stalk of celery. Boil gently for one hour stirring occasionally.
 Garnish with 1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley.
 This soup is not supposed to be thick.

GOURMET LEEKS

- 1½ lbs. leeks
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons shredded Parmesan cheese

Prepare and cook leeks. Melt butter in saucepan; stir in salt and lemon juice. Add leeks; heat through. Turn into serving dish; sprinkle with cheese.
 2 or 3 servings.

CHICKEN CASSEROLE DELUXE

- 1 pkg. (5.5 ounces) noodles Romanoff
- 1 can (10½ ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 2 cups cup-up cooked chicken or turkey
- 1 pkg. (10 ounces) frozen chopped broccoli, thawed and drained
- 1/2 cup ripe olives, cut into wedges

Heat oven to 350°. Prepare noodles Romanoff as directed on package except--use 3/4 cup milk. Stir in soup, chicken, broccoli and olives.

Pour into ungreased 2 quart casserole. Cover; bake 25 to 30 minutes or until broccoli is tender.

PICKLED BEETS

- 2 cans (1 pound each) sliced beets
- 1½ cups sugar
- 3/4 cup vinegar
- 2 three-inch cinnamon sticks

Drain beets, reserving liquid in small saucepan. Add sugar, vinegar and cinnamon sticks to reserved liquid. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly. Pour over beets; cool. Cover; refrigerate at least 8 hours. To serve, remove beets with slotted spoon.
 About 3 cups.
