## How to stay well---

Hydrogenated oil is a rapacious product bent on depriving you of the life energy in the food you eat. Its gluttonous ability transforms liquid oils into heavier fats such as Crisco, margarine and salad oils, none of which your body can assimilate.

Few of us give second thought to reading labels on packaged foods. Many commercial baked goods such as cookies, cakes, breads and crackers contain hydrogenated oils. The process of hydrogenation is a method of adding free hydrogen ions to a food to reduce its ability to oxidize and become rancid. Don't be misled by the advertising of a product that says it has unsaturated fats if it also says hydrogenated vegetable oils. Vegetable oils are better than animal fats but in order to transform them into non-spoiling fats they have to be heated, boiled reheated, bleached and hydrogenated so that every life giving quality is removed. In margarine, the unsaturated fats are carcinogenic because of the heating and processing are just as damaging to health as fried foods. (according to "Food and Nutrition" by J.I. Rodale). The body needs fats to produce energy and preferably vegetable fats, but they must be unheated and unprocessed. When these oils or fats are used and hydrogenated additional ions of hydrogen have been added making a heavier molecule which cannot pass the membranes of the digestive system, therefore depriving the body of this needed energy. So margarine is no better than butter even though it has unsaturated vegetable oils in which the fatty acids are killed by hydrogenation and artificial chemicals making it carcinogenic.

The catalysts in enzymes produced by the body will release the ex-

cess hydrogen ions into the circulation system which combine with vitamins and minerals in your food preventing their absorption, thus starving yourself. Body cells then rapidly deteriorate bringing on old age and many organic diseases. So don't buy processed food, for they surely have hydrogenated fats and never use fat drippings or heated oils for gravies and sauces.

Stick to natural cold pressed vegetable oils which are high in unsaturated fatty acids (linoleic acid) especially sunflower, safflower, corn, soybean and wheat germ oils.

Yes, hydrogenated oils will help you meet the grim reaper sooner than you expected if you don't read labels.
