PISTACIO LEMON CAKE

1 Pkg. Duncan Hines Lemon Cake Mix  
1 Pkg. Instant Pistacio Pudding  
4 Eggs  
1/2 cup oil  
1 Cup Milk  
1/2 cup ground nuts

METHOD:

Mix and beat for 10 minutes;  
add nuts and finish beating.  
Bake in greased pan for 60 minutes  
at 350°. While hot, poke holes  
in top with fork and spread  
mixture of 1/2 cup powdered  
sugar with enough lemon juice  
to spread glaze. (Cool)

You can bake this cake in a  
1/2 cup Bundt pan, or spring  
form pan.

Heat over to 450°. Grease 12

fork until smooth. Do not  
overbeat.

Fill custard cups half full.  
Muffin cups 3/4 full.

Bake 25 minutes. Lower temperature  
to 350° and bake 15 minutes  
longer or until deep golden  
brown. Remove from cups immediately  
and serve hot.

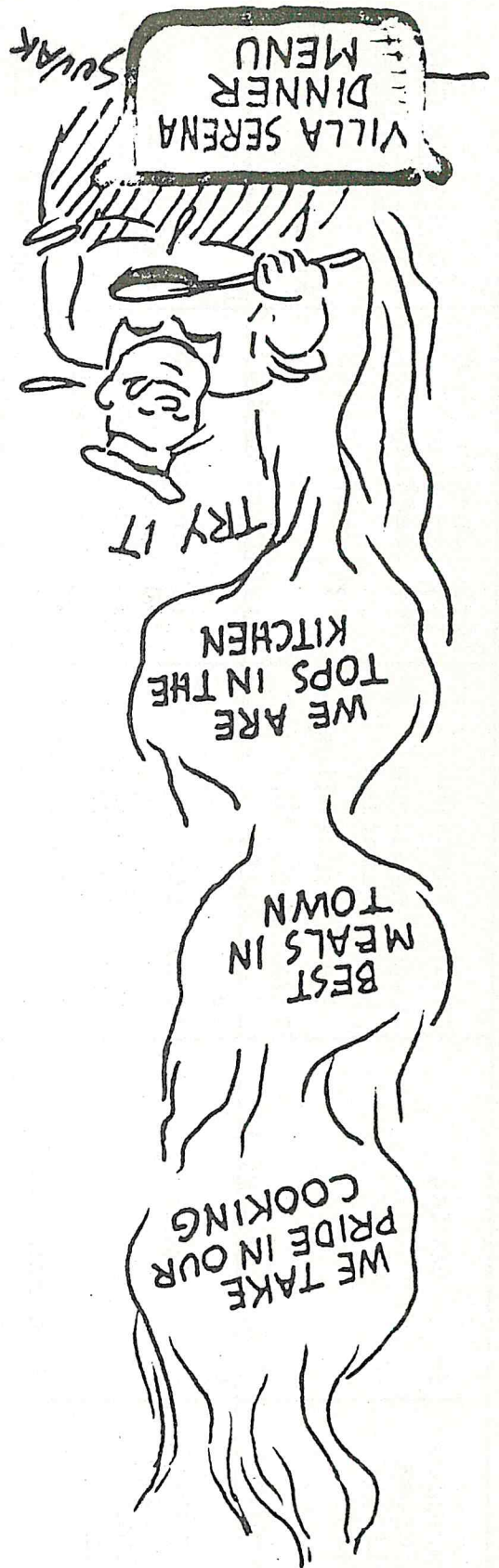
Makes 12 to 16 popovers.

BUTTER RINGS

1 Small Cake of Yeast  
1/4 Cup of Lukewarm Milk  
2 teaspoons sugar  
3 Cups Flour  
2 tablespoons of sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/4 lb. butter  
1/2 pint sweet cream or evaporated  
milk  
3 Egg yolks

Crumble yeast. Add lukewarm milk  
and sugar. Place in warm place to  
rise. When foamy add to sweet cream  
and egg yolks. Mis and set aside.  
Sift together, flour, salt & sugar.  
Work in butter. Add yeast, cream  
and egg mixture to flour & butter  
mixture. Mix well, place in refrig-  
erator overnight. Divide dough and  
roll each piece into strips and  
twist two strips together to form a  
ring. Let raise in warm place for  
2 hours. Bake in 325° oven for 20  
to 25 minutes. Make thick frosting  
of powered sugar & milk & frost while  
warm. Sprinkle with nuts.
