1 Pkg. Instant Pistacio Pudding
4 Eggs
1/2 cup oil
1 Cup Milk
1/2 cup ground nuts

1 teaspoon salt

Heat over to 450°. Grease 12 deep custard cups or 16 muffin cups. Measure all ingredients into mixing bowl. Stir with fork until smooth. Do not overbeat. Fill custard cups half full. Muffin cups 3/4 full. Bake 25 minutes. Lower temperature to 350° and bake 15 minutes

longer or until deep golden brown. Remove from cups immediately and serve hot.

2 teaspoons sugar

3 Cups Flour

1/2 pint sweet cream or evaporated milk

3 Egg yolks

Crumble yeast. Add lukewarm milk and sugar. Place in warm place to rise. When foamy add to sweet cream and egg yolks. Mis and set aside. Sift together, flour, salt & sugar. Work in butter. Add yeast, cream and egg mixture to flour & butter mixture. Mix well, place in refrigerator overnight. Divide dough and roll each piece into strips and twist two strips together to form a ring. Let raise in warm place for 2 hours. Bake in 3250 oven for 20 to 25 minutes. Make thick frosting of powered sugar & milk & frost while warm. Sprinkle with nuts.

In looking forward to the sunshine of the summer months, we are once again planning what has become our very own traditional Pre-Fourth of July celebration.


A scrumptuous Barbecue Rib dinner with all the trimmings topped off with all the watermelon you can eat. The date is THURSDAY, JUNE 25th.
