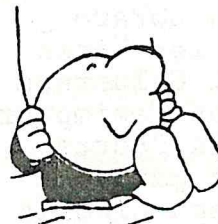

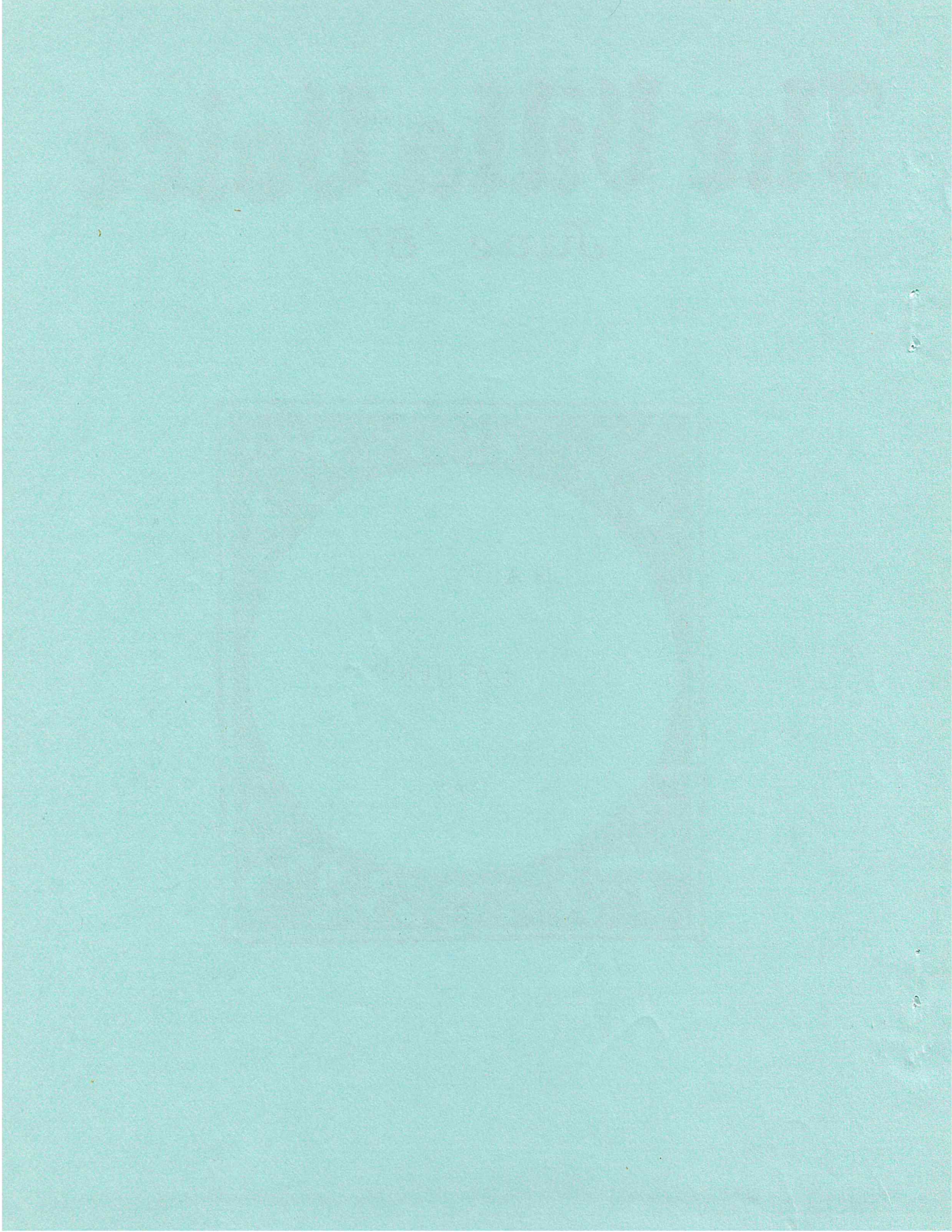
We must insist that only actual residents and registered members be allowed to purchase tickets at this very low price. Accommodations will be very limited so get your tickets early.
