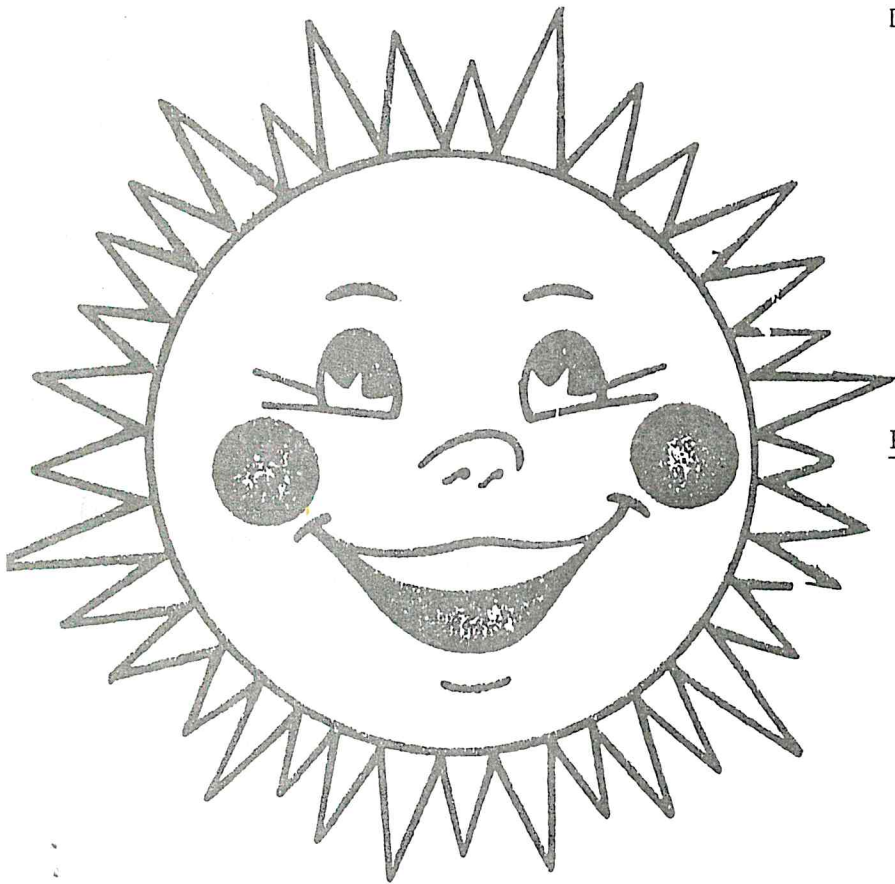

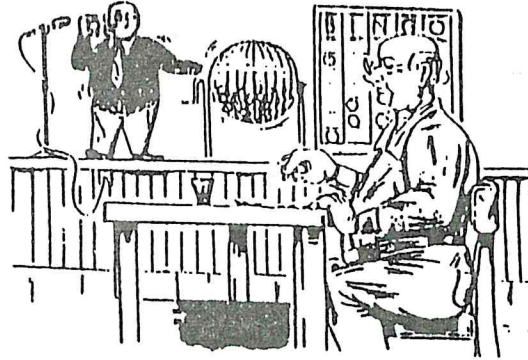

and song for everyone to enjoy.

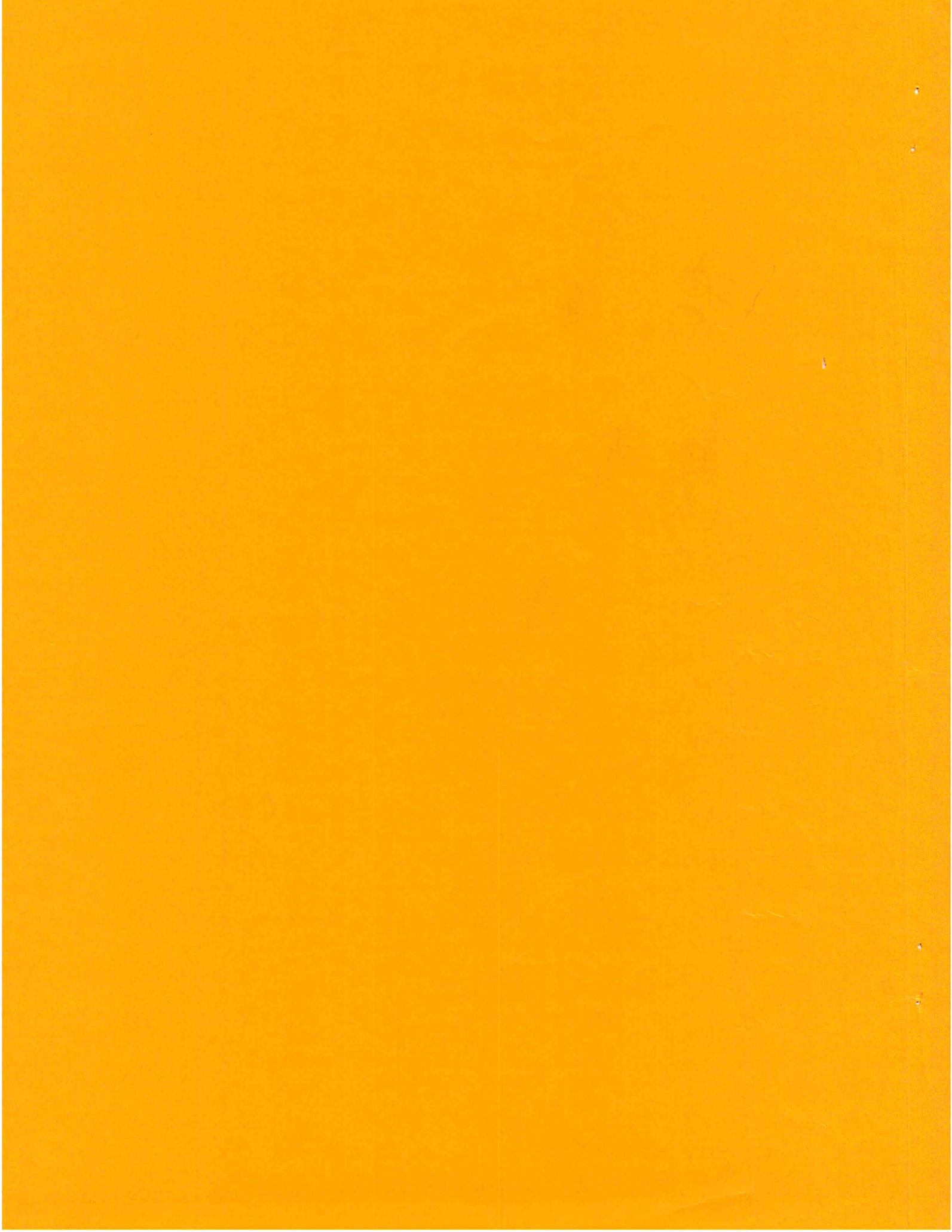
Let's all show our true patriotism
