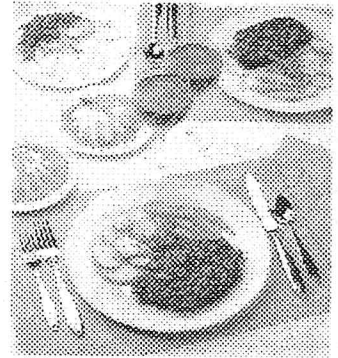

From St. Francis of Assisi's Bulletin

The kindergartners were talking about the Resurrection in school one day. Billy came home and told his mother he could understand about Jesus, but not about the roses. When asked to explain, he said "Why was Jesus a rose?"

No one gets out of this world alive! Not even Jesus. However, Jesus did more than just endure death. He transformed it, and made of it something positively life-giving.

Each of us faces our own "little deaths." None of us are exempted from experiences of failure, illness, disappointment, fear, depression, and separation. Our true glory comes not from "dodging" life's painful realities but from facing them with faith and living all the way through them.

It is our instinct to avoid suffering. We put a great deal of effort in our culture to guarantee a pain-free existence. Doctors and dentists assure us, "You won't feel a thing." We have come to see all forms of suffering as evils to be avoided at all costs, and feel that when suffering does come into our lives we must have failed and are somehow being punished. If we buy into that view, then the message of Easter will make less and less sense.

Jesus stands before His disciples with the wounds inflicted for our sins. He, too, had to pass through the valley of pain. But evil and sin did not have the last word. Jesus promises life after death. There is no payoff without suffering and hard effort. There is no life without death.

Our Birthday and Anniversary dinner will be **Friday, June 16th** when we welcome back Rico Giamarco and **The Rico Trio**. Rico is

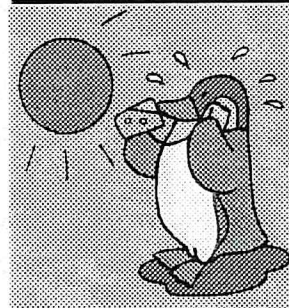
and old favorite with diners and dancers at The Villa so make your reservations right away.
