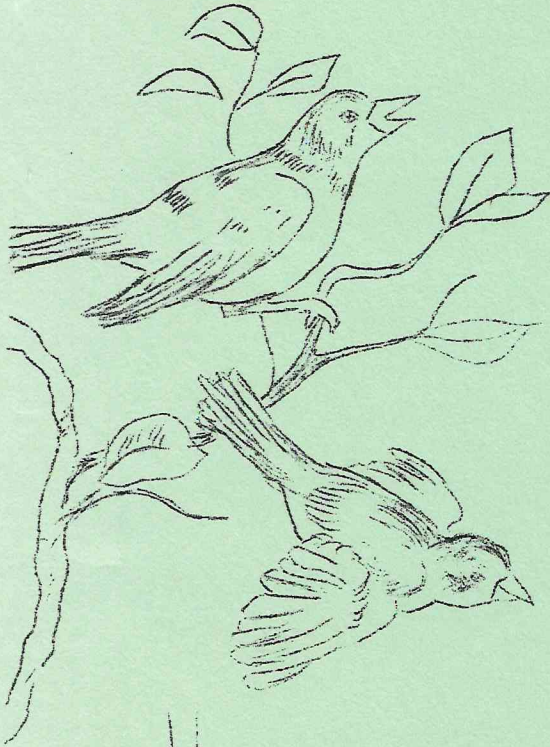

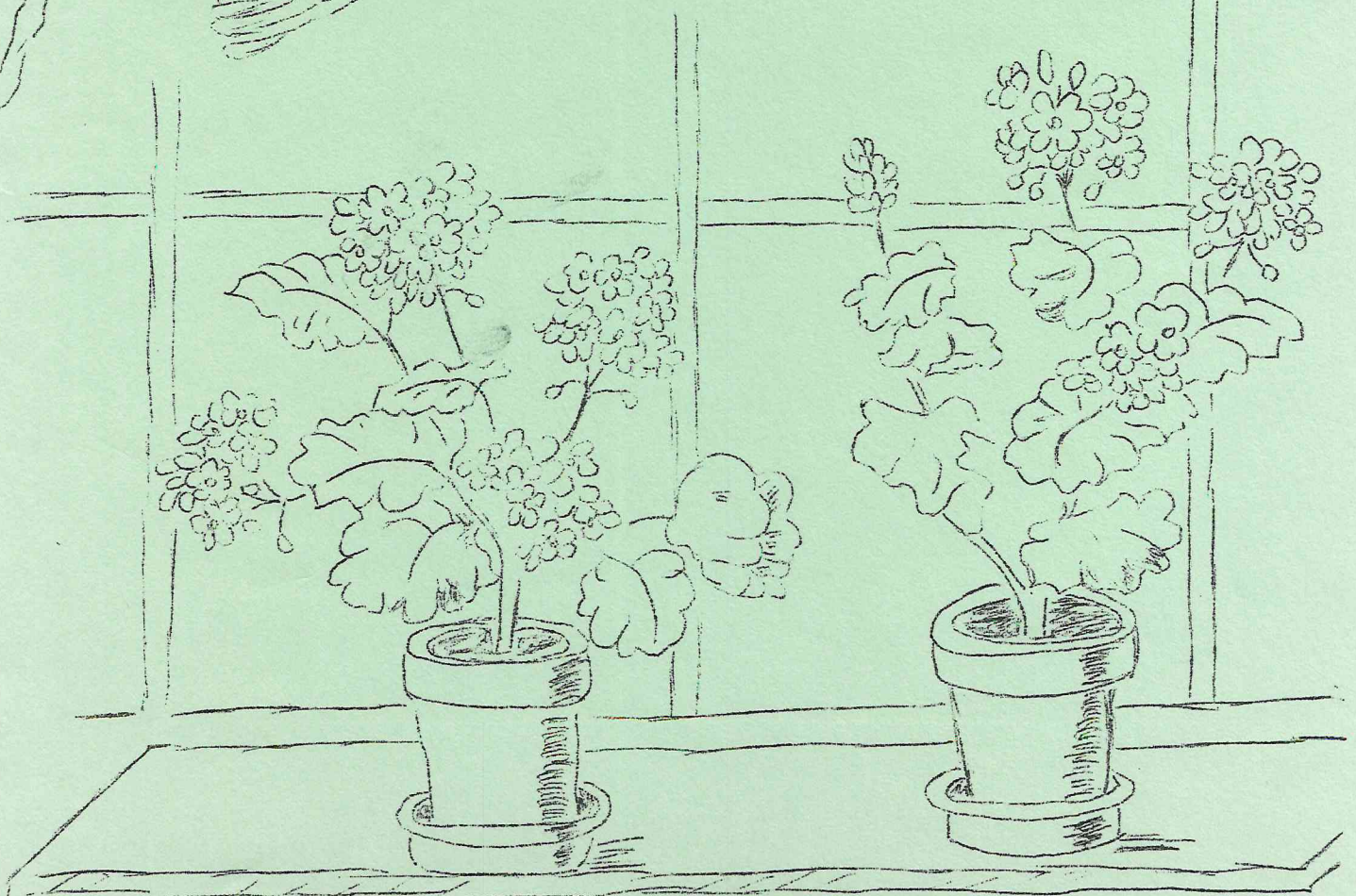

KITCHEN KORNER

POACHED EGGS AND SAUTEED
MUSHROOMS ON TOAST

In medium skillet over medium
heat in 1 tablespoon butter or
margarine, cook 1/2 lb. fresh
mushrooms, thinly sliced, for
5 to 8 minutes until lightly
browned.

Meanwhile, poach 4 eggs and
toast 4 slices bread.

To serve, spoon a layer of
mushrooms onto each piece of
toast; top each with poached
egg. Makes 4 servings.

PRALINE SQUARES
(Butterscotch Brownies)

- 1/4 cup shortening
- 1 cup light brown sugar (pack
(packed))
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup sifted flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans

Heat oven to 350° (mod.)
Melt shortening over low
heat. Remove from heat and
blend in brown sugar. Cool.
Stir in egg. Sift together
and stir in flour, baking
powder, and salt. Stir in
vanilla and pecans. Spread
in well-greased and floured
square pan 8x8x2.

Bake 25 min. until a light
touch with finger leaves
slight imprint. Don't over-
bake. Cut into bars while
warm. Makes 18 bars (2 1/2x1)
Store in tightly covered jar.
