HOW TO STAY WELL

We can safely say the greatest drug addiction in the country is drinking coffee. Tea, coffee, cola drinks and chocolate all contain caffeine which is a habit forming drug that gives your central nervous system a stimulation like that of a pep pill. this induced high wears off in an hour and a half you get jittery, more tired and have to have another "fix", meaning more coffee, tea, cola, cigarette or sugar snack. Now you might say, "Well, I drink decaffeinated coffee". This is not much better because you still add sugar and cream, both harmful toxic foods. Besides decaffeinated coffee has been processed with trichloroethylene, a cancer producing chemical. TCE has been suplanted by most manunfacurers with methylene chloride. This chemical adds chlorine to the body which is another toxic agent which also combines with some foods depriving them of digestive enzymes. If you are a working person the company coffee break is another tempting diversion to stimulate your run down body. Dr. Melvin Page of Florida a researcher of degenerative diseases, believes that caffeine may be a major cause of high blood pressure, cancer, arthritis, lung disease, diabetes and senility. A cupy of coffee contains 100 to 150 milligrams of caffeine. Tea at full strength is about the same but it also contains tannic acid and theobromine both of which are toxic elements. Arrhythmia, or irregularities of the heart, can be caused by drinking more than five cups of coffee or tea daily. So why not avoid paying the doctor or hospital for your indiscretions and switch to herb teas from your health store which do not contain caffeine but have desireable oils and a world of variety. If you want to use a sweetener, use a little honey or karo syrup. Or better yet concentrate on drinking fruit juices. As I said previously, one should not drink a liquid when eating.


It will be a super night of enjoyment and "CHEER" (hic!) cause we will as usual be serving that "good old Irish Brew".
