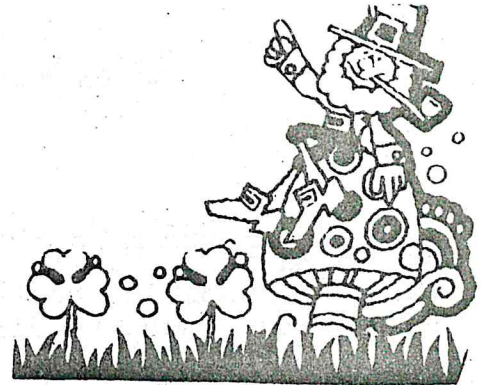

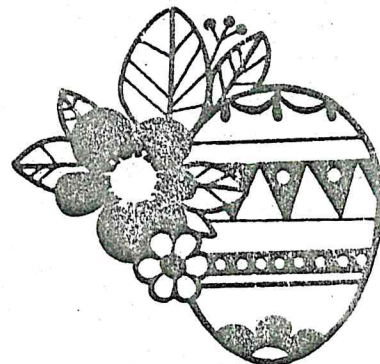
SEWING CLASS NEWS
