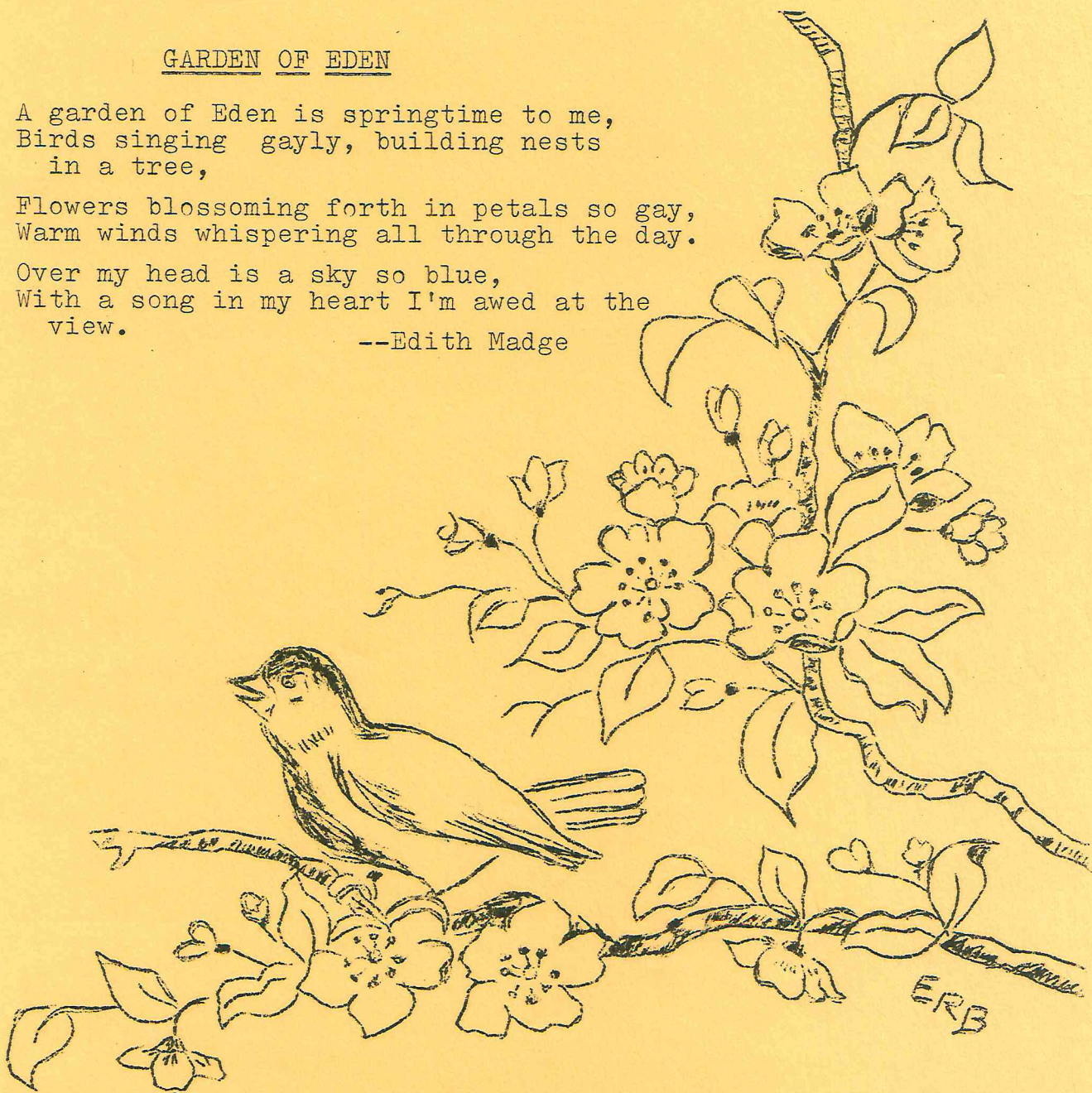
GARDEN OF EDEN

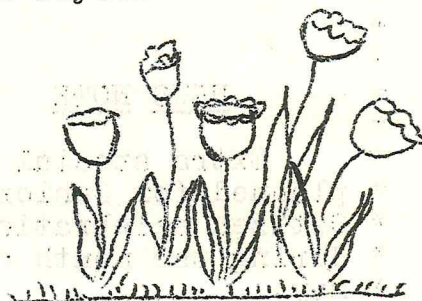

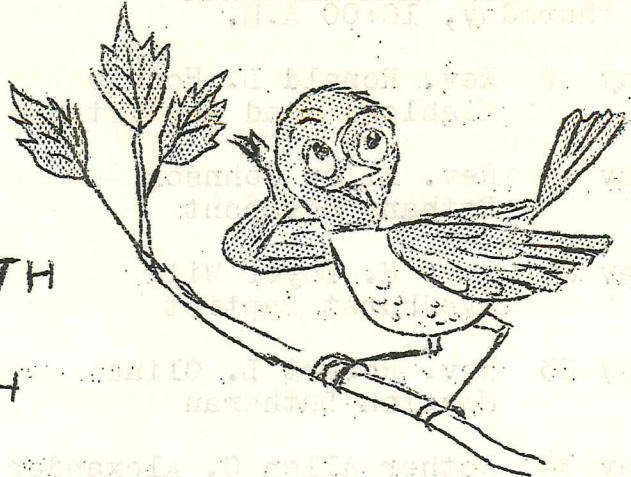

KITCHEN KORNER

GINGER ALE COCKTAIL

Arrange alternate layers of well chilled grapefruit sections and pineapple tidbits in sherbet glasses. At serving time fill glasses with very cold ginger ale, and decorate with red or green cherries. If fresh fruit is used, sprinkle each layer with powdered sugar, and let stand a while before adding ginger ale.

PUDDING FUDGE

To one package of chocolate pudding add 1/4 cup milk and 1/2 pound of margarine, melted. Bring to a boil over medium heat stirring constantly. Boil 1 minute; remove from heat. Blend in 1 3/4 cups sifted confectioner's sugar. Add 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract and 1/2 cup chopped nuts. Turn immediately into a greased pan 8 x 6 inches. Let stand in cool place until cold. Cut in squares. Makes one pound.

Halving your large potatoes before baking them will lessen fuel consumption. So will rinsing potatoes in hot water, after they've been pared and washed for boiling. This warms the spuds and the water will re-boil after they are added.

Don't heat a whole teakettle of water when you need only 2 cups.

TUNA VEGETABLE SUPPER

- 1 medium cauliflower
- 1 cup sliced carrots
- 2 Tablespoons chopped onion
- 1 Tablespoon butter
or margarine
- 1 can (10 1/2 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom or celery soup, undiluted
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 1 can (7 ounces) tuna fish, drained and flaked
- Dash nutmeg
- 1/2 cup crumbled crackers

Separate cauliflower into small flowerettes. Cook with carrots in boiling salted water until tender-crisp. Drain. Meanwhile, saute onion in butter until tender. Combine onion, soup, milk, tuna, and nutmeg; mix well. Turn cauliflower and carrots into a 1 1/2-quart casserole. Pour soup mixture over vegetables. Sprinkle with cracker crumbs. Bake at 350°F. for 40 minutes or until slightly browned. Yield: 4 portions.

EASY CHOCOLATE PIE

- 1 large or 6 small Nestle chocolate bars
 - 16 marshmallows
 - 1/2 Cup milk
 - 1 Cup heavy cream, whipped
 - Graham cracker crust shell
- Melt chocolate bars and marshmallows with milk. Cool. Add whipped cream and turn into crust. Chill.
- 6 servings.
