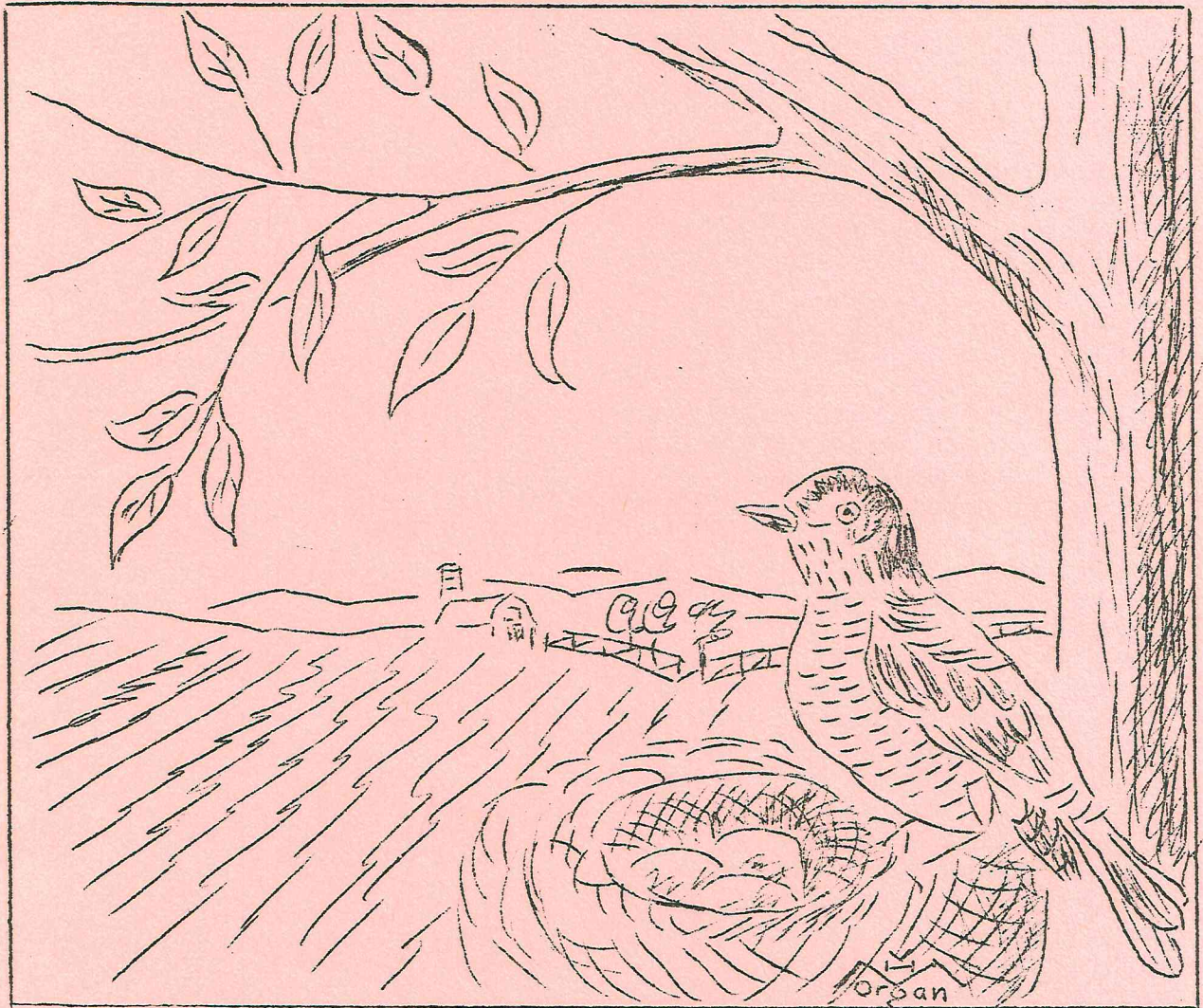

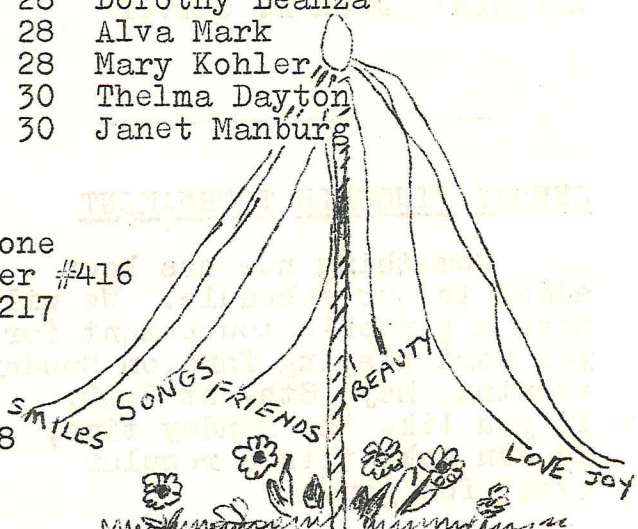

KITCHEN KORNER

TOMATO AND CABBAGE SOUP

- 1 can tomato soup
- 1 cup chopped cabbage
- 1 chopped onion
- 1 chopped green pepper

Dilute the tomato soup with an equal quantity of water. Heat to the boiling point. Then add cabbage, onion and green pepper. Cook for 20 minutes. Double quantity if more soup is needed. One teaspoon of sugar will improve this soup.

- 3 chicken livers
- 2 tbs. chopped olives
- 1 tesp. prepared mustard
- 3 slices bacon

Wash and cut liver in half. Sprinkle each piece with salt and pepper. Spread with mustard and chopped olives. Wrap with bacon. Roll in bread crumbs, and bake in hot oven from 10 to 15 minutes.

HAM PUDDING

- 1/4 lb. of butter
- 5 eggs
- 10 ounces chopped ham or  
  corned beef
- 10 ounces riced potatoes

Cream butter with 3 egg yolks and two whole eggs. Add to this chopped ham or corned beef and the boiled riced potatoes. Then beat the 3 egg whites stiff and stir into the mixture. Put into a well-greased pudding dish and bak 1 hour.

Serve with horseradish sauce... a very hearty dish.

BANANA COOKIES

- 1½ cups flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 3/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 cup shortening

Mix all of the above ingredients together. Add:

- 1 cup mashed bananas
- 1 3/4 cups oatmeal
- 1/2 cup nuts

Mix all together and drop on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350° for 12 to 15 minutes.

Spread wheat germ bread with butter or mayonnaise. Arrange thin slices of cucumber and radish on bread and sprinkle them with lemon juice and salt.
