selves.

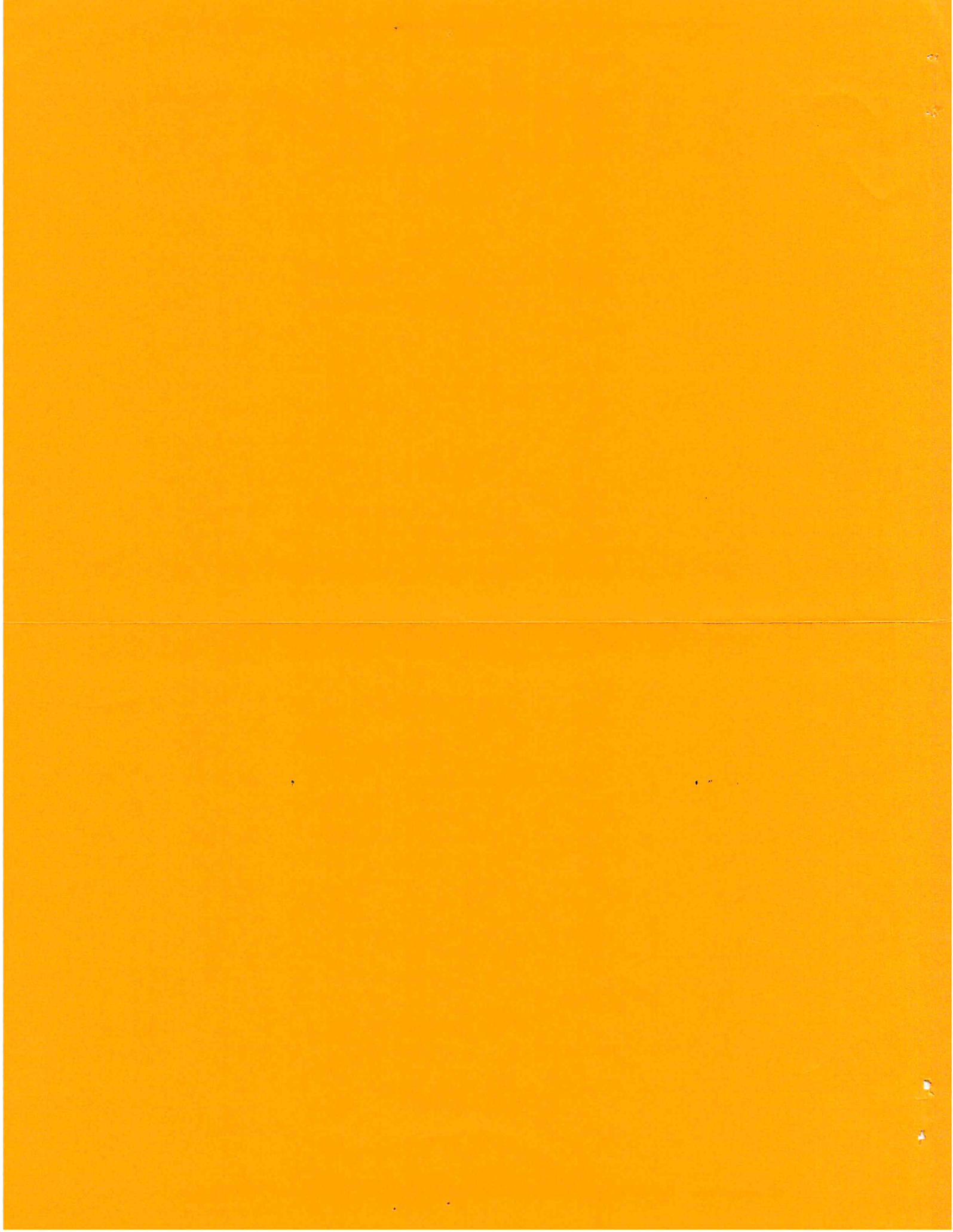
In quiet recollection, Mother's
