


"Joseph E. Kall has many callings in life. To begin with, he is chairman of the social and behavioral sciences departments at Notre Dame College in South Euclid, Ohio. For the past 18 years he has been professor of political science and history there and this summer he was the faculty moderator for a defense strategy seminar at the University of National Defense in Washington, D.C.

"He is also a Lt. Col. in the Ohio Air National Guard and director of intelligence for the 121st Tactical Fighter Wing at Rickenbacker Air Force Base in Columbus.

"In high school, Joe starred on the 1948 Ohio State title winning baseball team. He later earned a bachelor of fine arts degree in photography, a bachelor of science degree in commerce and a master's degree in political science, all from Ohio University.

"In July of this year he was elected to a third consecutive term as Chairman of the Lake-Geauga Regional Board of Education for the diocese of Cleveland. He is in his fourth year as coordinator of the CCD classes at his home parish of St. Anselm in Chesterland, Ohio. In 1971, Kall was selected as an outstanding educator because of his contributions to the advancement of higher education and his service to the community.

"Joe also teaches physical education at St. Anselm School and at Notre Dame Elementary School in Chardon, and he lectures to Golden Agers at the Villa Serena, Mayfield Heights, and Musicians Towers in Cleveland Heights.

"Kall lives with his wife Shirley Ann and their five children at 7550 Green-field Trail, Chesterland."

KITCHEN KORNER

MOCKED STUFFED FISH

Four cups water
2 onions, sliced thin
2 stalks celery, diced
2 medium-sized potatoes, sliced
1 can (1 lb.) salmon
1 onion, grated
4 tbs. matzoh meal
3 eggs, beaten separately
Salt and pepper

Bring the water to a boil in a saucepan. Add the sliced onions, carrots, celery, potatoes and half the salt and pepper. Remove the skin from the salmon; flake and combine with the grated onion, beaten egg yolks, meal and remaining salt and pepper; fold in the beaten egg whites. Form into balls. Place gently in the boiling water and vegetables; reduce the heat; simmer. Remove the balls to a platter; let cool. Chill. Serve with the vegetables and soup in which they cooked. --Amelia Nagy

RAW POTATO NOODLES

I good sized raw potato 2 cups flour 2 eggs 1 teaspoon salt

Grate potato into the flour, add salt and 2 eggs; knead together to a smooth dough; then roll out to 1/4 inch thickness. Let stand for 30 minutes, dust with flour and cut into 1/4 inch noodles and boil 10 minutes in salted water. Drain well, pour melted butter over it. Serve either as a vegetable or a garnish with fish or meats. It also can be used in soup, in which case cut the noodles a little finer.




