KITCHEN KORNER

APPLESAUCE MEAT LOAF

1 lb. lean ground chuck.
1 cup soft bread crumbs
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/4 cup chopped celery
2 Tbs. chopped onion
1/2 tsp. prepared mustart
1 tsp. salt, also pepper to taste
1/2 cup applesauce
1 Tbs. brown sugar
1/2 tsp. prepared mustard
1-1/2 tsp. vinegar.

Combine meat with next seven ingredients. Mix together lightly but thoroughly. Lightly pack into a loaf pan. Make a depression lengthwise in top of loaf. Mix together remaining ingredients and fill depression.

Bake at 350 degrees for one hour.

PINEAPPLE CARROT CAKE

- 3 eggs
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup oil
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 Tbs. cinnamon
- 2 Tbs. soda
- 1 cup crushed pineapple, well
 drained
- 2 large carrots, pared and grated
- 1 cup chopped nuts.

In a mixing bowl, beat eggs until light. Beat in sugar and oil. Mix in dry ingredients. Stir in pineapple, carrots and nuts. Bake in a greased and floured 10-inch tube or Bundt pan at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

CHEESE CAKE SQUARES

1 tube (1/3 box Graham crackers, crushed.

1/3 cup sugar

1/2 cup margarine, melted.

FILLING:

2 pkgs (8 ounce each) cream cheese 2 eggs 1/2 cup sugar 1 tsp. vanilla.

TOPPING:

1-1/2 pints dairy sour cream3/4 cup sugar1 tsp. vanilla and chopped nuts.

Mix together first three ingredients. Press into bottom of an ungreased 9x13 inch baking pan. Combine the filling ingredients and beat until smooth. Pour over crust. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Remove from oven and let cool for 5 minutes. Blend sour cream with remaining sugar and vanilla. Pour over the cheese layer and sprinkle with nuts. Return to oven and bake 15 minutes more. Chill, then cut into 1½ or 2 inch squares.

Then eat and enjoy!!!!!!!

The State of Ohio has inaugurated an energy credits program. This program is designed to give relief to the high cost and continuing increases of utility bills.

To qualify you must be a head of household residing in your own home, must have attained the age of 65 or older by December 31, 1979 and an annual income not exceeding the sum of \$9,000.00.

If and when you qualify under this program, you will receive from the State of Ohio, an amount equal to 25% of the cost of your utility bills for the winter months.

For your convenience, applications are available at the Villa Serena office for those who desire to complete the same and take advantage of any savings in their utility bills.






