5. Stoves are not for heating - only for cooking.
6. Do not block air outlets or returns with furniture or curtains.

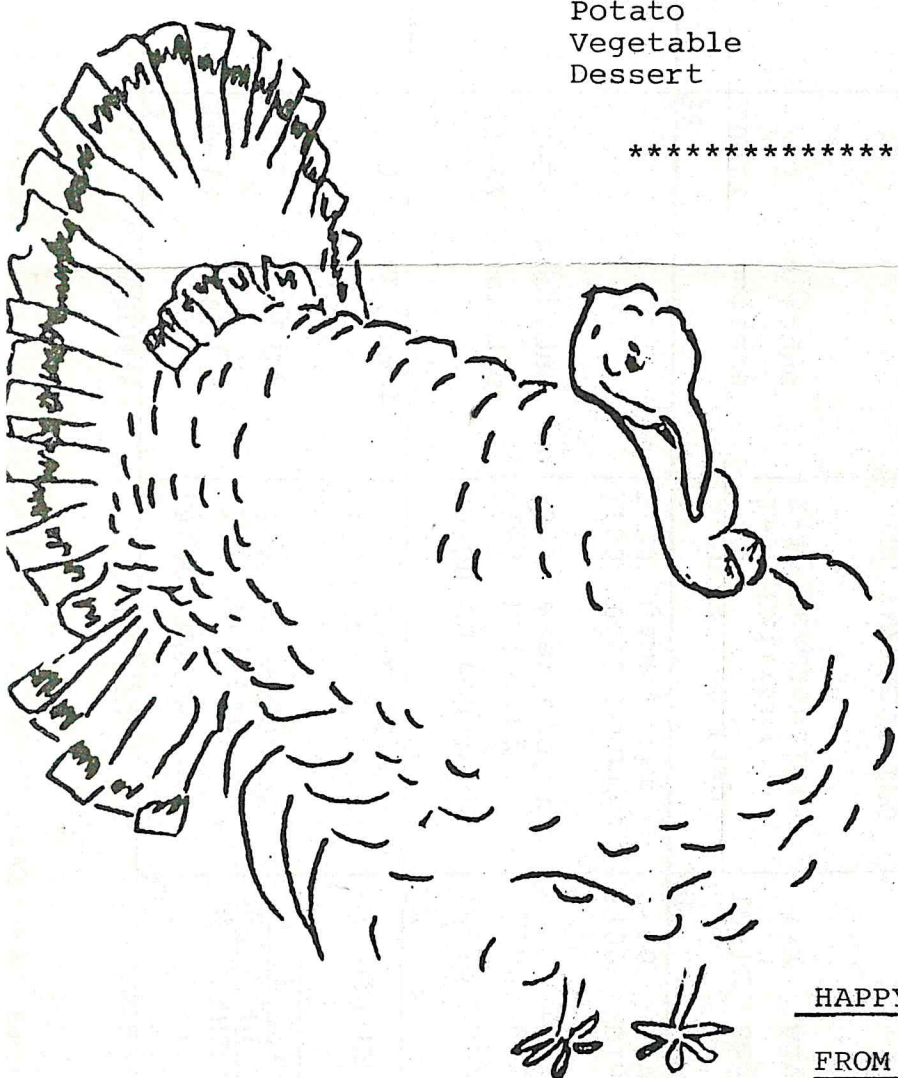

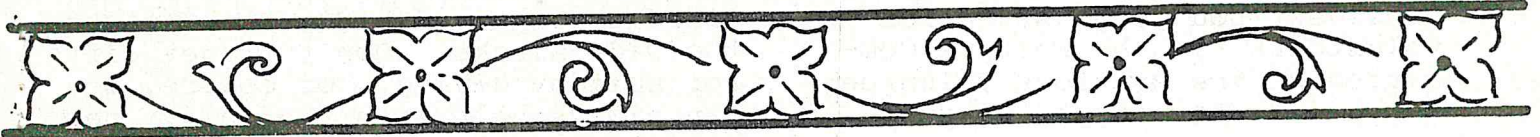
BOUTIQUE CLASS NEWS

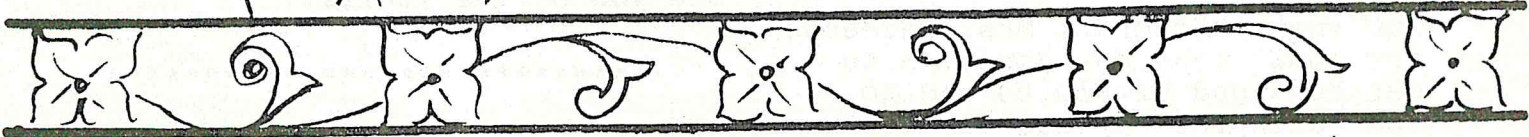
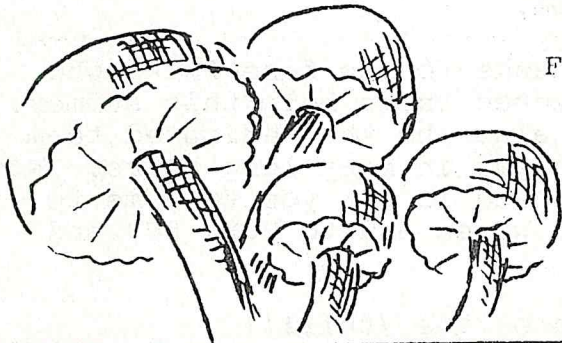

can all dress and dine elegantly.

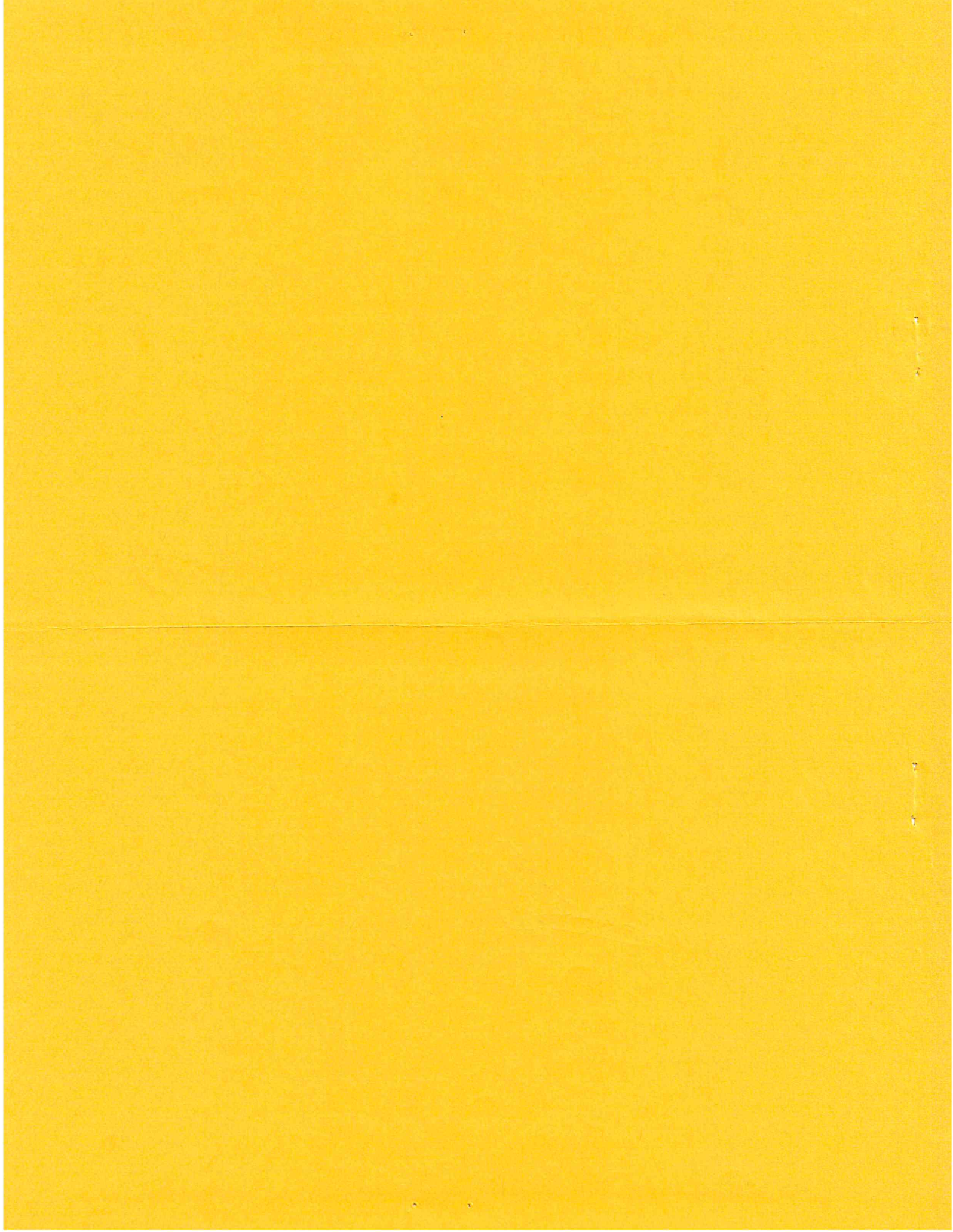
After dinner, we will adjourn into
