18th.

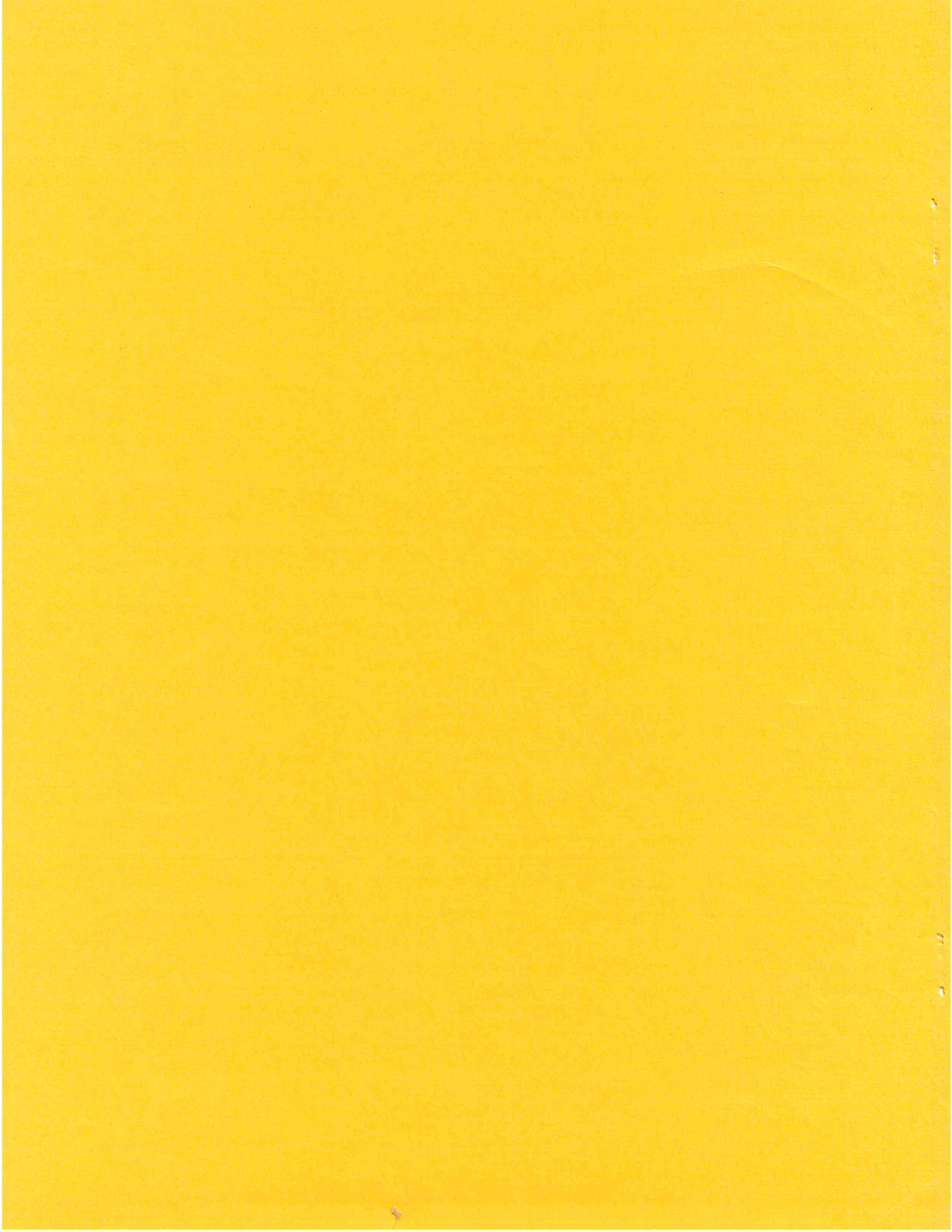
It has become a time for us when
