

We will count our blessings as we join together in our traditional Thanksgiving Dinner at the Villa Serena on THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 18th.


It has become a time for us when we all gather and pray as one family to express our gratitude for the many joys we have experienced and bow our heads in thanksgiving.
