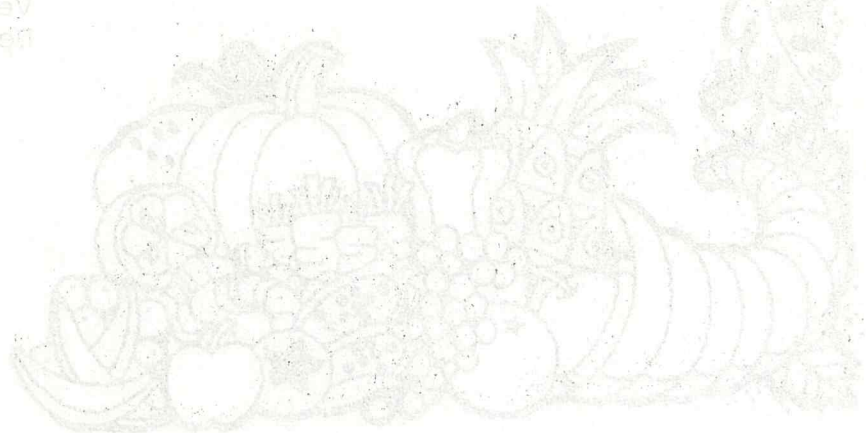

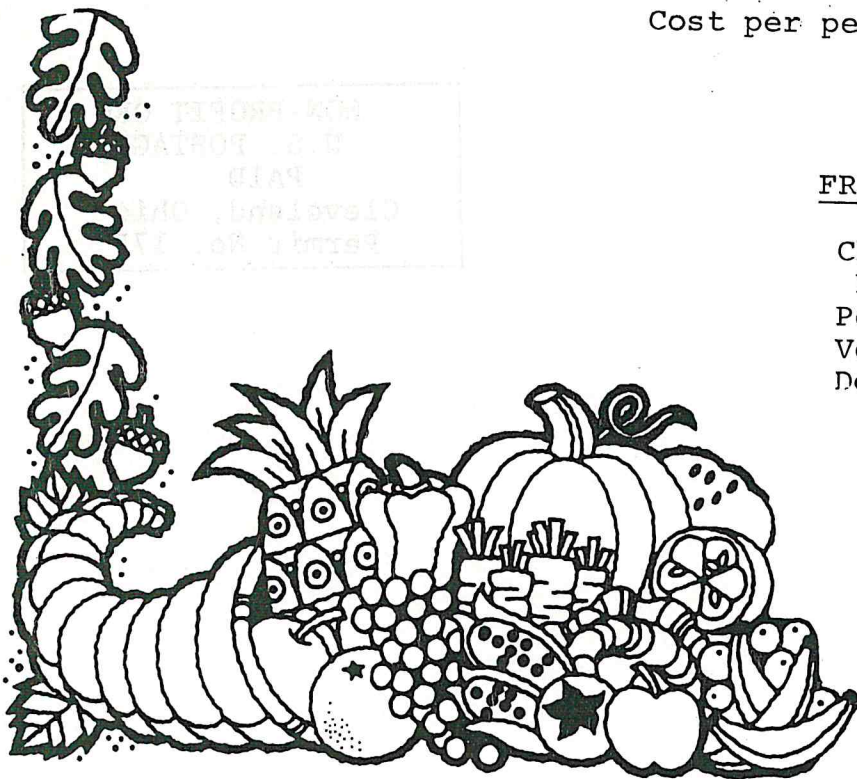

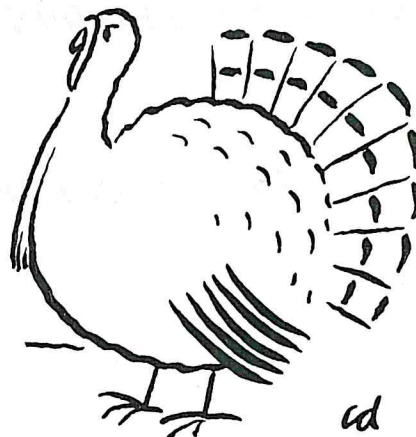
See you at our Thanksgiving celebration on Friday, November 16th.
