


KITCHEN KORNER

CHICKEN WITH RICE

1 fat chicken (3 1/2 lbs.)
2 T. chicken fat
Boiling water
1 medium-sized onion, chopped
1 cup rice
Salt and paprika

Clean and cut chicken into pieces for serving. Salt and let stand several hours. Heat fat in heavy kettle, add onion, fry golden brown and remove onion. Then fry chicken in the fat and when slightly browned, add paprika to taste; cover with boiling water, and let simmer about 1 hour, to yield 3 cups broth. Soak rice in cold water, drain, add the fried onion, I teaspoon salt and 3 cups of the chicken broth gradually. When rice is nearly done, add chicken and finish cooking on a very small flame, pot tightly covered. Care must be taken that rice should not get too soft.

OATMEAL MUFFINS

1 cup warm cooked oatmeal
1 cup flour
1/4 cup sugar
4 tsps. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
1/3 cup milk
1 egg
4 T. melted butter

Mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt; add oatmeal and work until well mixed. Add remaining ingredients. Beat well. Bake in buttered muffin pans 20 minutes.

LEARNING ABOUT THE MICROWAVE OVEN

She was most interesting in telling of the history of the microwave oven and explaining very clearly what to do with it and what not to do. Mrs. Schuler baked a cake in five minutes and cooked a chicken which she served over rice and mushrooms in ten minutes.

Cooking Hint: In cooking, follow as far as possible the rule of the druggist in compounding any mixture, that is, mix the ingredients thoroughly, putting in one at a time. For instance, if you have three ingredients mix two before adding the third, and stir in the third well before adding a fourth, and so on. Always measure dry materials first.


