YES, we are busy planning our big "scarry nite" celebration for Halloween. A night you would not want to miss.

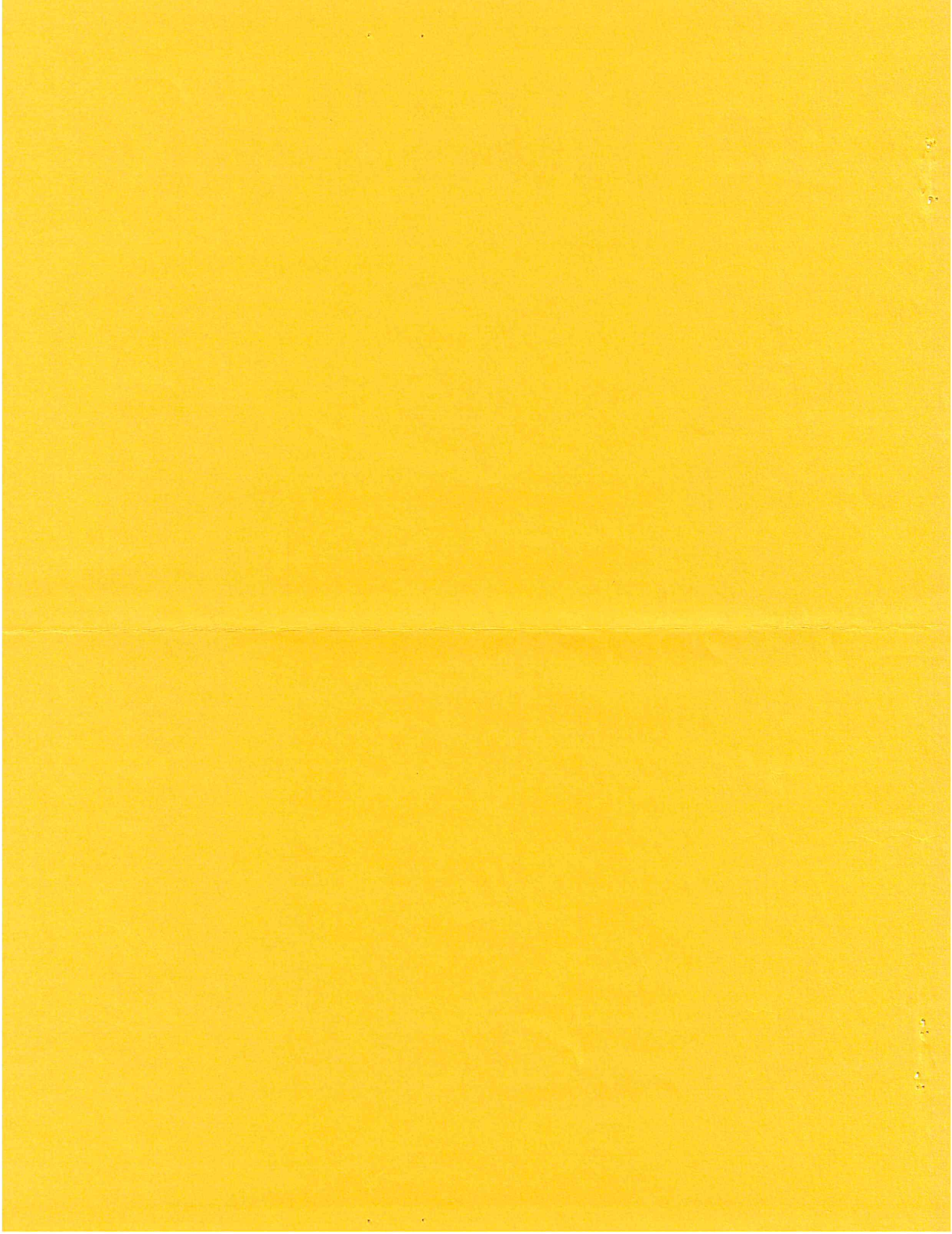

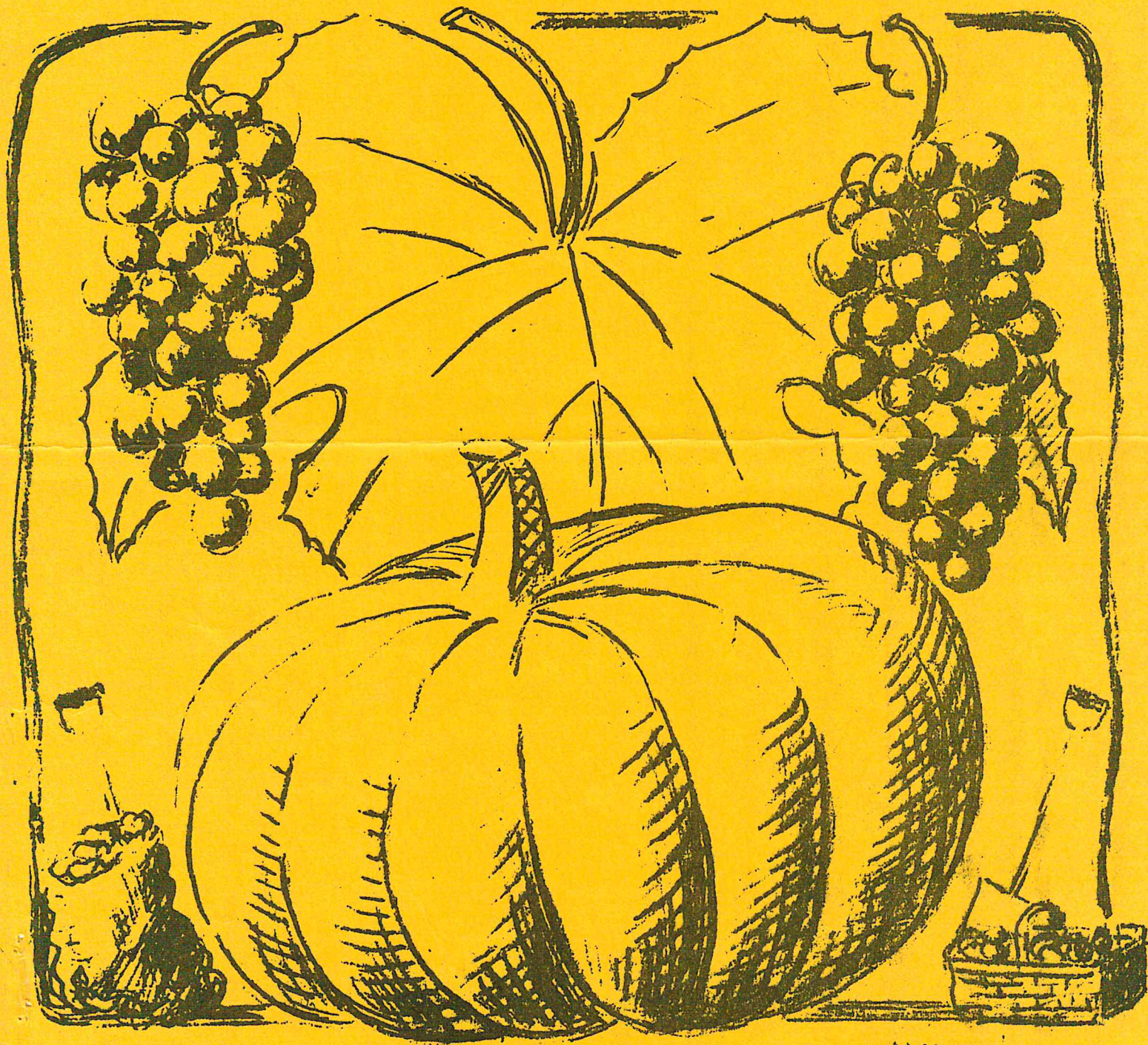
