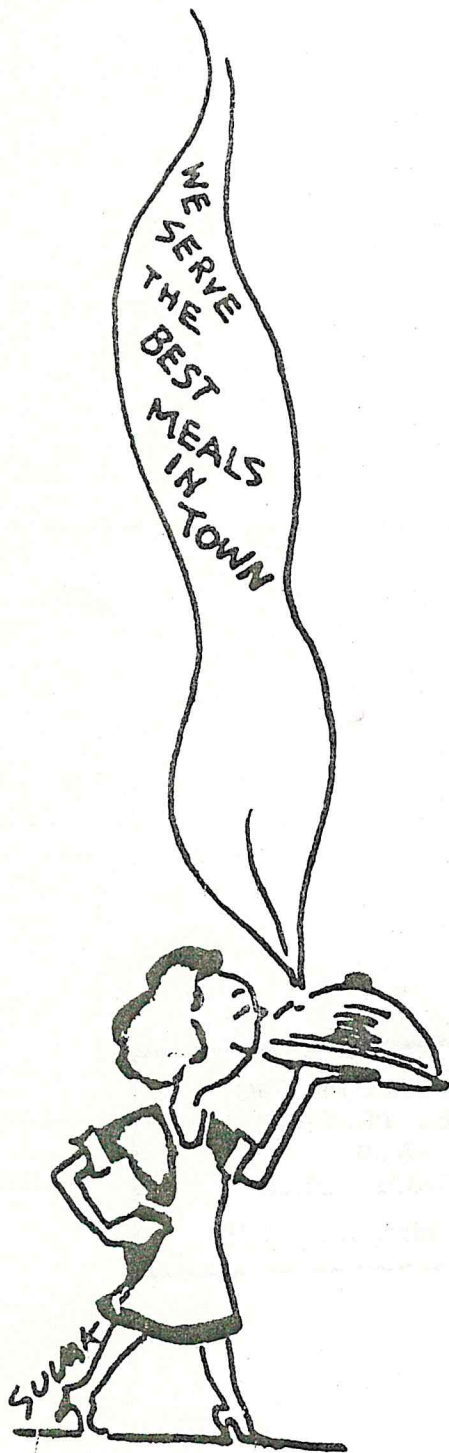



WEDNESDAY CARD PARTIES

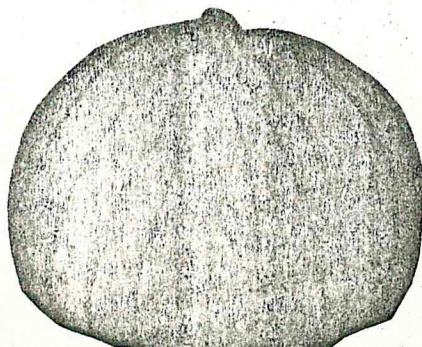
Here we are again: If anything out of the ordinary happens in your game, let me know and I can put it in the column.

## SEWING CLASS

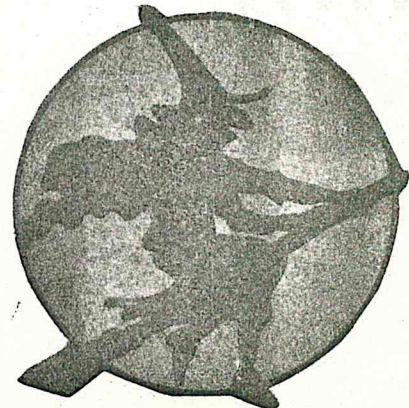
