



Repairs Begin

Roof Work Completed, 8th Floor Cheers

After a late start due to excessive rainy weather, our new roof was completed in August, the result of many months of planning and five weeks of actual work. Repairs are now being effected in suites which had water damage due to the old leaky roof.

Villa Serena hired a consultant, expert in roofing matters, to assist in the bidding monitor process and to progress on the job. The new roof, built with the most up-todate methods, is of a rubber

composite material, and should last for many years. The workers who, by the nature of the job, had to be intrusive, were praised for courtesy and their responsiveness, and minimizing noise as much as possible. Work included clearing backed up drains, reroofing the elevator penthouses, and the removal of the old air conditioning system.

There was some inconvenience which was

unavoidable for residents, of The huge crane course. which lifted materials to the roof and the gondola semi truck body which received the scrap through the eight story chute were parked in the lot outside the kitchen for the duration of the job, blocking parking spaces and causing detours.

But the work is done, and the inconvenience a thing of the past although we will never see it, we can be glad that last year's rent increase has gone to a purpose which will benefit many of us. Thanks to all for a job well done.


Library Seeks Bibliophiles


