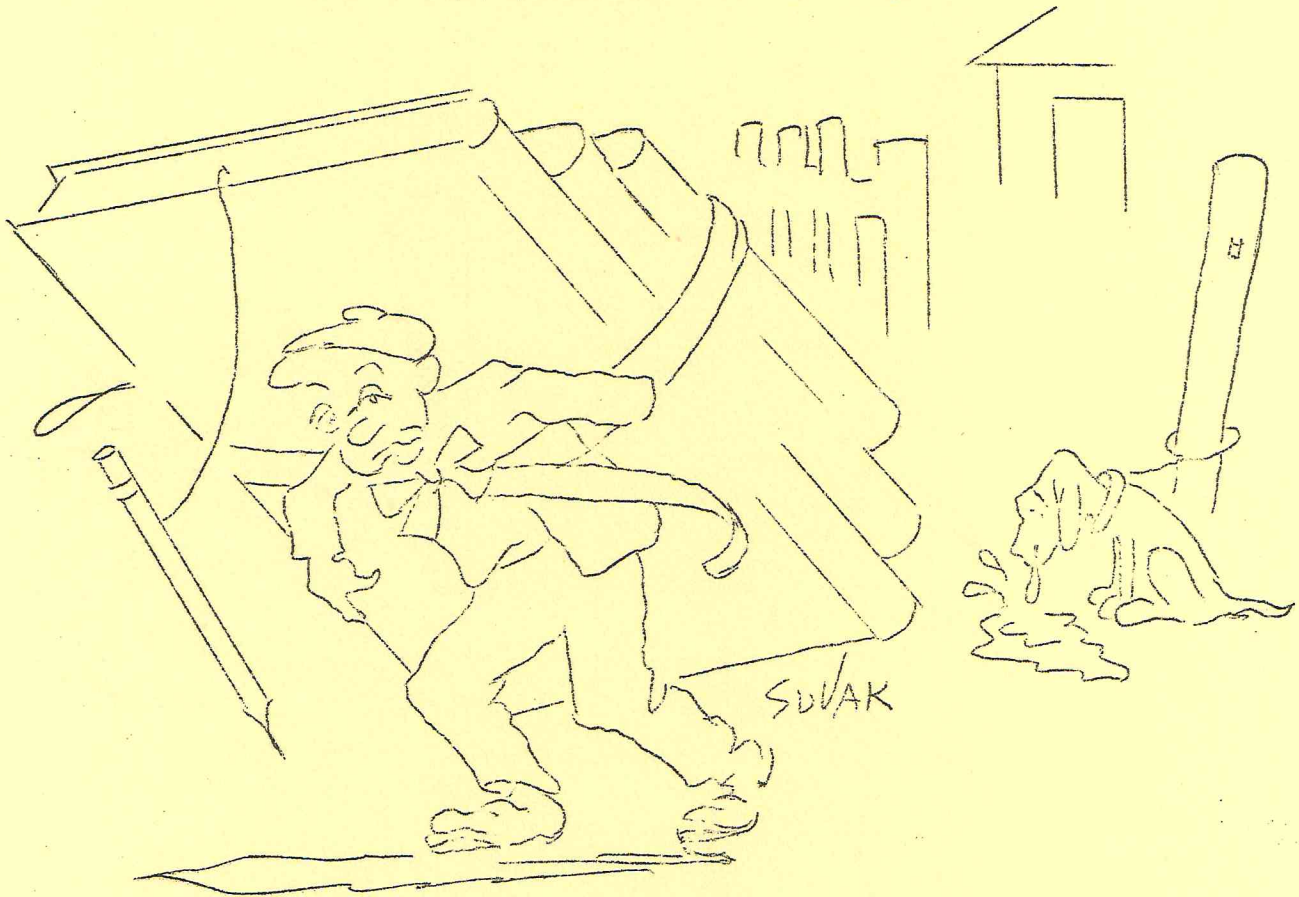

ROAST PORK

Select sparerib, loin, or shoulder for roasting. Wipe meat, place in pan with 1 cup water, sprinkle with salt and pepper. Dredge meat and bottom of pan with flour. Baste often. Bake in moderate oven, allowing 25 minutes to the pound. Serve with cranberry or apple-sauce.

Note: When roasting pork, slit it at intervals and insert slices of tart apple. The apple cuts the grease and gives the gravy a delicious flavor.

FRIED EGGPLANT

Parboil skinned eggplant. Cut in very thin slices. Sprinkle with salt and pile slices on a plate. Cover with weight to draw out juice. Let stand one hour.

Dredge with flour and fry slowly in butter until crisp.

Another way would be to dip in egg and cracker crumbs and fry in deep fat.
