
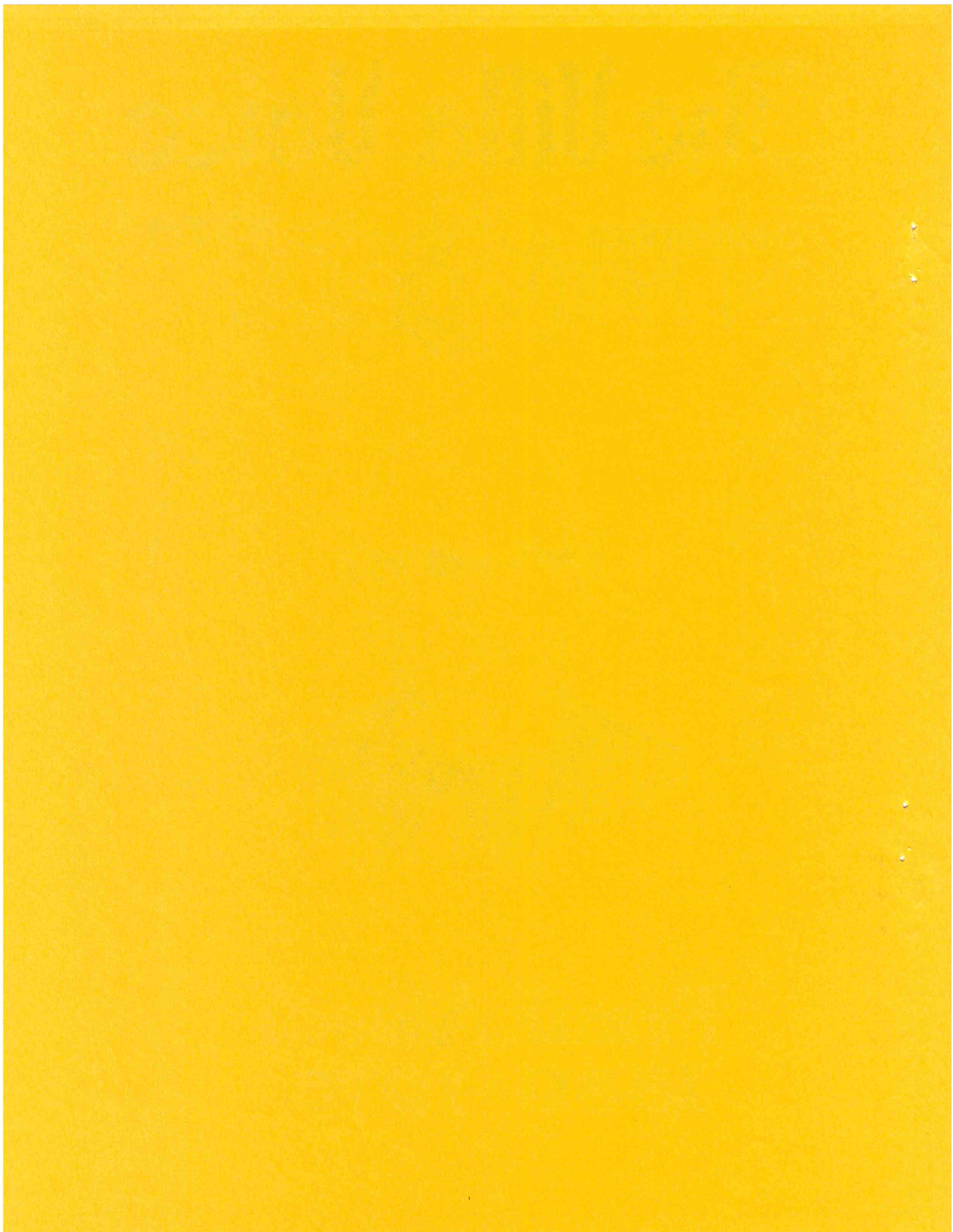

KITCHEN KORNER

VANILLA VIENNA COOKIES

1/4 lb. butter
1/8 lb. sugar (little more)
2 hard cooked egg yolks
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 lb. flour

Cream together for 1/2 hour, butter, sugar, hard cooked egg yolks. Then add vanilla, and flour and knead until dough is smooth. Let it rest for a while in a cool place. Roll out dough and cut into round cookie shape. Then take half of rounds and cut a center hole in them with a thimble; spread with egg whites and sprinkle ground walnuts mixed with a little granulated sugar.

Bake all at 325 degrees for 15 minutes. When cool put jelly in center of the whole round and press the one with hole on top to form a sandwich.

ASPARAGUS OMELET

1 lb. asparagus (fresh)
(cut in small pieces)
3 Tbl. margarine
3 eggs
1 Tbl water
Salt and Pepper

Melt margarine; add asparagus. Beat eggs and add to asparagus and margarine along with salt, pepper and water. Cook over low fire, covered. When mixture is hard on top, flip to plate. If sticky, add a little margarine and brown lightly on other side.

PORK AND RICE CASSEROLE

4 thick pork chops
1 can chicken rice soup
1 can water
1/2 cup raw rice

Season and brown chops in small amount of fat. Place in casserole. Pour chicken soup and water in frying pan and bring to boil to absorb the drippings. Then pour over chops and add the raw rice. Be sure raw rice is completely covered with liquid. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hour.

BROWN SUGAR COOKIES

1 cup brown sugar
1/2 lb. butter
1 egg yolk
2 cups flour
1 tsp. vanilla

Cream butter and sugar, add egg yolk, flour and vanilla. Mix well. Take pieces of dough and roll into small balls, size of a marble. Press down with prongs of fork which has been dipped into flour. Brush top with unbeaten egg white. Place in center candied bit of cherry or walnut. Bake in moderate oven for 20 minutes.

Household Hint: Add baking powder to flour for breaded chicken; makes it crisp.
