We are once again bringing our ever popular Travelogs back. We will attempt to obtain wonderful educational films.

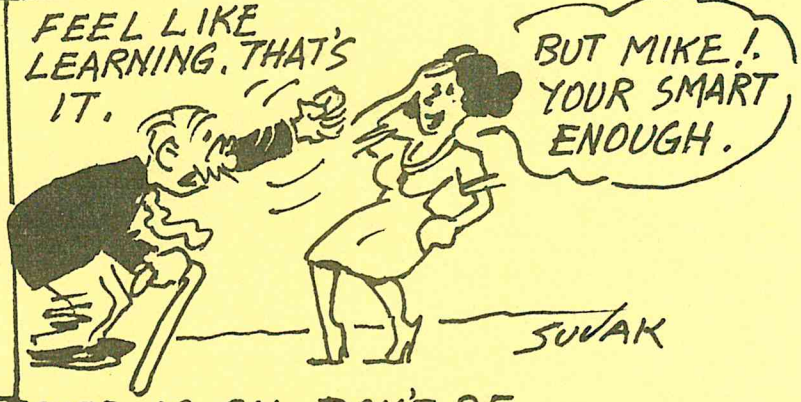
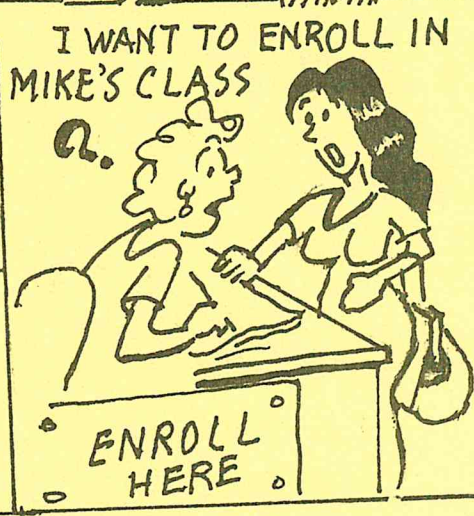
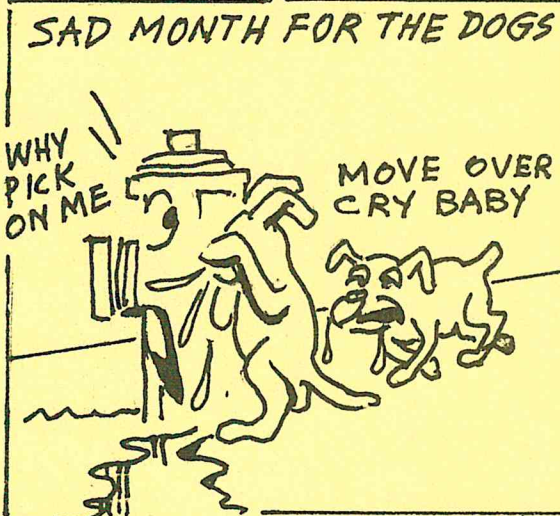
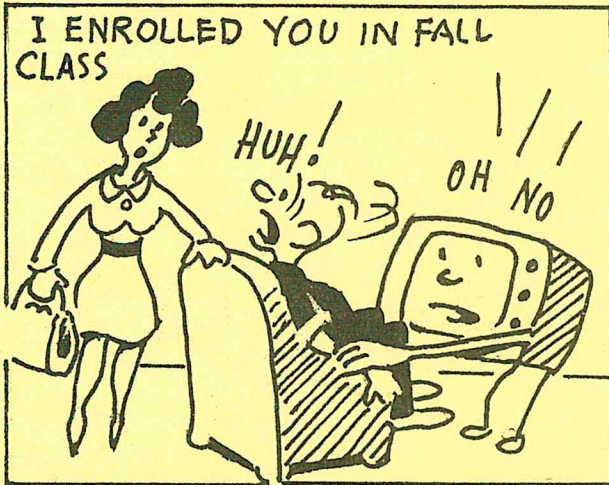
