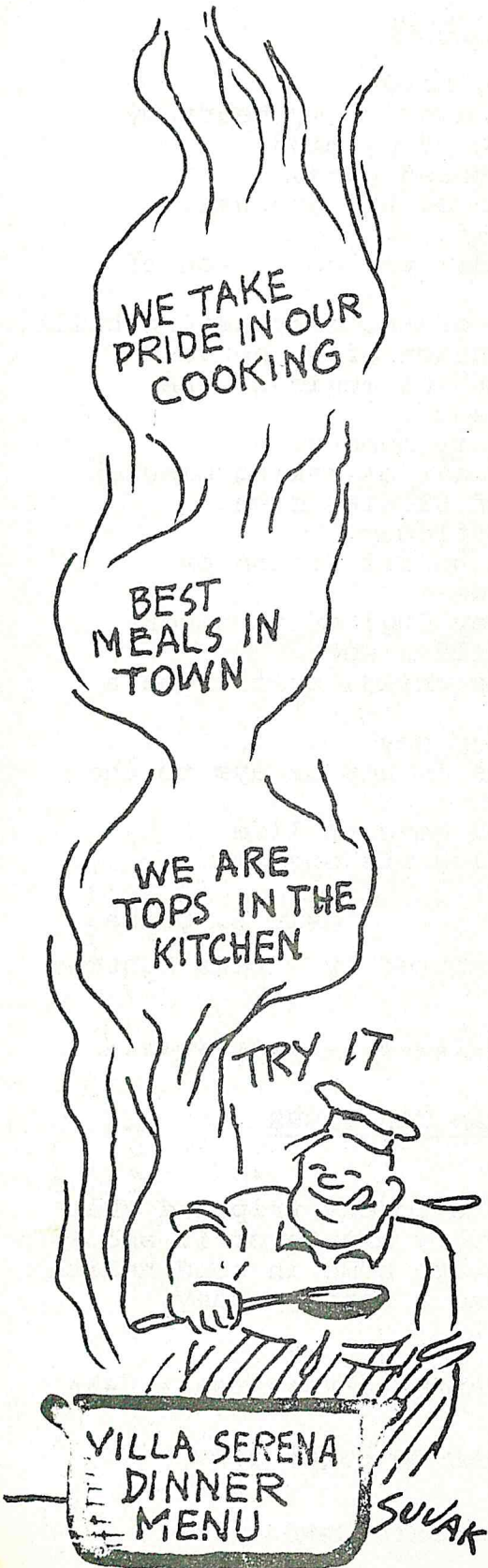

And also for a new change we will have our program of entertainment before we break bread together for dinner at 5:00 P.M.

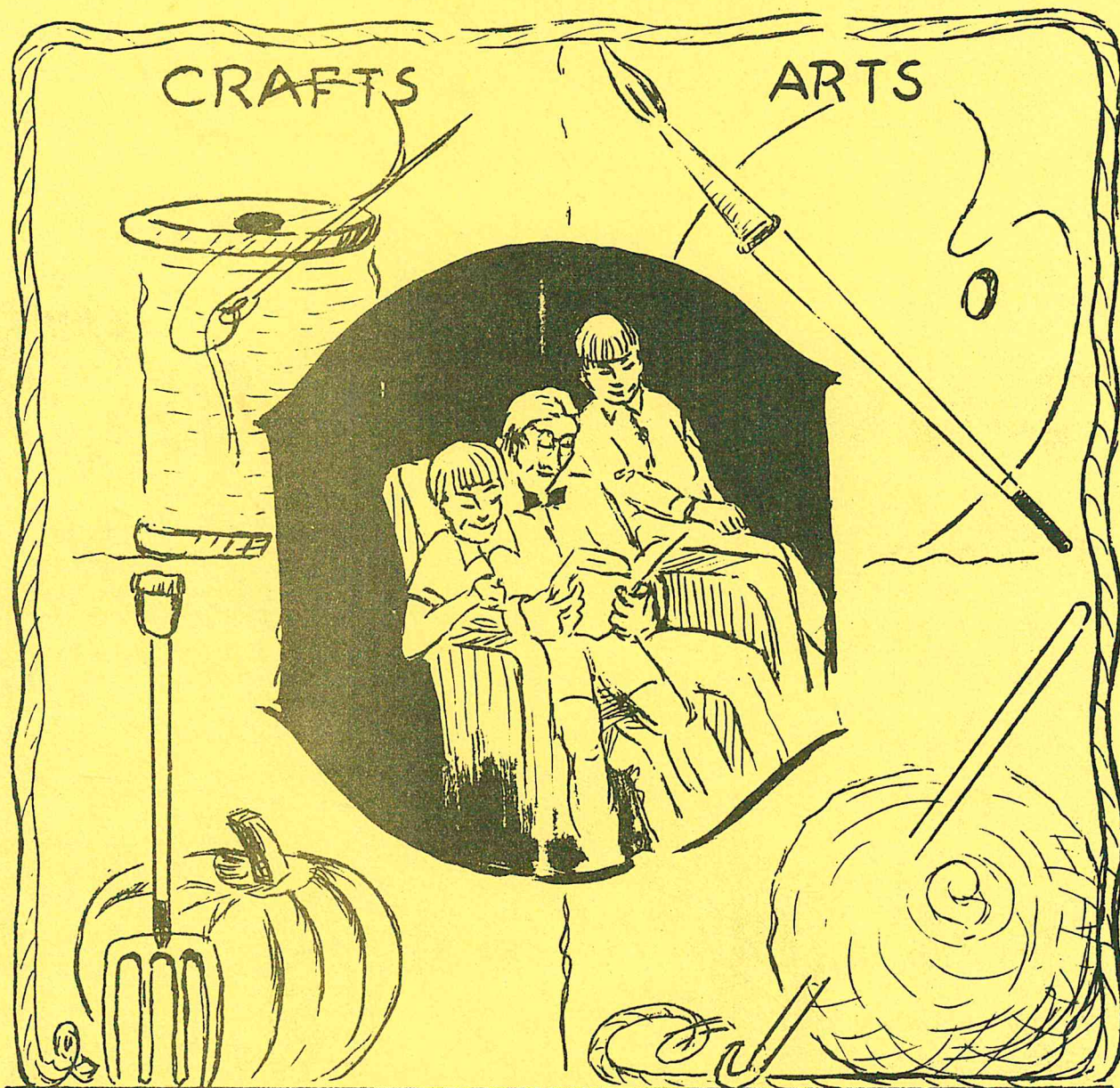
