



#### DINNER AND DANCE



As we once again begin our new year of fall schedules and activities, the Villa Serena as always, dedicates itself in helping each person who enters our doors find happiness and friendship.


Join us in welcoming back our very dedicated and outstanding teachers who come each week for a variety of courses. Participate in their classes, there is so much to learn from them!


Music appreciation programs are in the planning. We shall endeavor to present a variety of musical programs to please every one's taste in music.
